# 'Bee-lieving in a sustainable future

Did you know that loss of natural habitat and pesticide use are leading causes to the decline in bee populations over recent years? Without bees and other pollinators, we would not have the fruits, vegetables, nuts and berries that we love to eat every day! But how can we help?

We are proud to present our new Pollinator Garden project between James S. Bell Junior Middle Sports and Wellness Academy and Landscape Plus! Our pollinator garden will contribute habitat and food resources to support local bee populations and it will be an integrated outdoor learning space for classes at the school. Even better, it will grow curiosity and respect for nature in our students and community! Students will be able to get outside and learn about

our local plants and animals, grow them a healthy habitat and be inspired to find ways to care for the environment. Every effort helps respond to the global issue of bee population decline. Local solutions are where it all starts. If we keep the green spaces of our community healthy and diverse, we can inspire others to take the same pride and grow towards a sustainable future.


