- Do household chores together.

- Create a team atmosphere by having all family members participate in choosing where to go for dinner, what movie to watch etc.
- Remind your child that everyone has strengths and ask them to think about what other assets team members bring to the table particularly in areas where they do not get to choose who they must co-operate with.
