Travelling abroad for March Break? Measles is just a plane ride away. Last week, TPH <u>announced an investigation of a confirmed case of measles</u> linked to travel. This virus continues to spread in many parts of the world. If you are planning to leave the country over March Break, get the best protection for you and your loved ones by staying up-to-date with your routine vaccines, including the measles vaccine.


