NEW: How do I apply for Out-of-Area Admissions?

Provided the school is permitted to receive applications, you may decide to apply to attend a school other than your designated school by address. Some schools are only able to accept applications from students attending feeder schools, or from students with a sibling already in attendance in Grades 10-12 and returning to the secondary school next year.

The Online Out-of-Area Admissions application will be available on Monday, January 8-26, 2024.

PLAR: Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR)

Canadian & World Studies Department



Students in Ms. Geary's Crime and Criminal Justice course, participated in a Crime Scene analysis in early December. This interdisciplinary course focuses on the elements of crime, criminal behaviour and the legal institutions in our society. In the weeks leading up to this hands-on experience, the Gr 12 students learnt the basic skills of Forensic Investigations. These skills include understanding the types of evidence left at a crime scene, how to package evidence, analysis of tool mark and shoe print

impressions, fingerprinting basics - including how to lift fingerprints - and blood science. This unit of the course is usually a favourite of students, as each lesson includes a hands-on

activity where they have the opportunity to practice the skills that are being taught to them. The unit of study ends with the examination of a Crime Scene, where students are given the opportunity to put their new skills into practice and solve "The Modelling Agency Murders". The students worked to uncover clues, photographed evidence, took observational notes, analysed blood patterns and spatter and even lifted real fingerprints left at the scene of the crime. It was an authentic learning opportunity for all students, they were engaged and had a great time!
