#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Whether we realize it or not, we are insatiable consumers of media. From the moment we open our eyes and check our email to our last post before we go to sleep, we are exposed to an endless variety of media, each with its own strengths and abilities. Media enable us to do so much, from forging personal identities to establishing social consensus, yet we always take them at face value and rarely look beyond their shiny surface. How much influence do these media have on our lives, and to what extent can we influence them? How do media shape the world around us? What are the real motives behind the media we use, and how are these motives kept hidden from view? This course provides an introduction to the relationships between media and the broader social and cultural world in which they operate, and allows for critical reflection on individuals' roles within those media.
