Post Secondary Info Session

Student Accessibility Services at York University will be hosting a post-secondary transition event, ASD Transition Day, on February 17, 2022. To register, please complete this <u>ASD Transition Day Registration Form</u>. Registration will close once they reach the maximum number of participants. This is an information day for students on the Autism Spectrum or those with a Non-Verbal Learning Disability (NVLD) and their families. It is intended for students who are in grades 10, 11 or 12 and are planning to attend a post-secondary institution (university or college). Topics to be discussed include: transition realities for students and their families, accessing support systems at university/college, strategies for academic success, social life at university/college, and nurturing independence

Free Skills Upgrading Classes for Adults in Toronto

Community Services is operating free Essential Skills Upgrading (ESU) classes remotely for adults in the community. Individuals seeking to upgrade math, reading/writing or computer skills so they can pursue more education or employment should visit <u>upgrademyskills.ca</u>.

Credit Recovery Night School

The Toronto District School Board is offering current TDSB students the opportunity to recover one or two compulsory credits through a new night school credit recovery program. All classes are virtual. Regular attendance in the virtual environment is a requirement.

All courses run one night per week, either Tuesday or Thursday from 6:30pm - 9:30pm. Students may enroll in one course, either on Tuesday or Thursday, or in two courses, one on Tuesday and one on Thursday.
