
SAC News

Asian Heritage Month at TDSB

This year marks the 20th anniversary of Asian Heritage Month. It was formally recognized in Canada through an official declaration that was signed in May 2002. Subsequently, the Province of Ontario passed the Asian Heritage Act (2005), and the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) passed a motion to recognize Asian Heritage Month in 2007. This year's theme is **Continuing a legacy of greatness**. Macdonald will be celebrating Asian heritage month through our cultural display boards and daily morning announcements.

Jewish Heritage Month at TDSB

Since 2018, throughout Canada, the month of May is known as "Canadian Jewish Heritage Month. Jewish Heritage Month provides an opportunity to remember, celebrate and educate future generations about the inspirational role that Jewish Canadians have played and continue to play in communities across the country.
