Student Attendance and Safe Arrival

The TDSB recognizes that regular attendance is essential to the safety, academic and well-being of all students. The TDSB acknowledges the legal responsibility of students and their parent(s)/guardian(s) to ensure attendance and punctuality. The TDSB will report, track and monitor student absences and lateness. The TDSB will address problematic and prolonged absences and lateness through timely measures or interventions by the principal, guidance counsellors, classroom teachers, social workers, and other appropriate staff employed at the school or in central departments. More information is available on the TDSB website under Policy P085—Student Attendance and Safe Arrival.

Dressing Appropriately:

Brrrr...the weather is getting cold again. Please make certain that your child is dressed appropriately. The best way to prepare for both indoor school time and outdoor recess time is to have your child dress in layers. Students also need indoor shoes that stay at school. A warm coat or jacket and snow pants and water proof boots are necessary once the weather is below freezing or if there is snow on the ground. All children need to have hats and mittens or gloves as well. Long scarves can be a safety hazard for children. Please make sure that the scarf is not too long and that it is tucked in safely in their jacket. Please label all outdoor clothing. This is the Toronto District School Board Cold Weather Policy: When temperatures and/or windchill factor indicates –20 to –28, recess may be shortened to 10 mins and lunch recess to 20 minutes. When the temperature and/or wind chill factor indicates -28C or lower, children will remain indoors due to risk of frost-nip and frostbite.
