Treasurer	 The new budget was presented by the outgoing treasurer for the upcoming 2016/2017 year. Appendix A includes complete details. The budget is smaller than in the prior years. Technology will still be the largest item in the budget with a focus on maintenance. Technology expenses will decline. Other notable savings will be due to the change in the approach for lice check (moving away from a private provide to public health) and the community engagement programs, Scientist in the Classroom programs will be supported for younger grades. Linda Grant presented information regarding the Sick Kids reading program training and tools which have been utilized this year in the Special Education program to help students with reading. The results have been positive and funding has been approved to allow for additional teachers to be trained. Liddy Beck and Mark Burton presented discussed rationales for the increased use of tablets in the French and G1 programs. The required numbers of tablets was discussed and consensus was reached regarding the number of units to be utilized for each program. 	Motion to pass the budget as presented and discussed, unanimously passed.
Fundraising	 Fall Fair raised \$15K. The topic of wrist bands was discussed. Based on a small sample of interviewed parents, the bands were well-received. Changes to pricing might be considered in the future. There was a discussion regarding the effects of the Direct Donation program. There might be ambiguity during the transition year regarding the impact of the Direct Donation program. For example, fundraising has been impacted during the Fall Fair. 

Overview/History

In 2016 a project was created to bring together two very different communities by creating a collaborative community awereness project. The Goal of this project was to have the students get to know each other in a safe way while sharing things about themselves, their communities and their goals. We believe this will start to *break down barriers, misconceptions and stereotypes* that the communities have of each other. Our hopes are that we can continually work together in creating a partnership for years to come. By utilizing various types of media and having the students work together at TIFF to create a documentary, not only re-enforces elements of the school curriculum but teaches students a very valuable lesson, that they aren't that different after all.

90 students will be invited to participate in the project this year from both schools and they have an opportunity present their videos/ projects to their own schools and communities.

Staffing Update:

We are currently in the process of conducting interviews to find Ms. Della Vedova's replacement following the rather prescribed protocol mandated under Reg 274. We are hopeful that we will have a teacher in place by the end of this week. Ms. Chau (6A) will be taking a short leave commencing Nov 9th. We are still uncertain as to the return date of Mr. Singh (2D).

System Update:

With the creation of the Learning Centre structure, TDSB is still in the process of figuring out of how to best service all of its schools. Meeting structures have not been set as the plan is to have schools with similar improvement goals come together to share best practices/ learn from each other. We are fortunate in the sense that our administrative team is the only representative from our Learning Network on several critical system-wide committees including Elementary Advisory, Special Education Steering, Principals' Advisory and Elementary Athletics. Membership in these structures is of the utmost benefit to our school as it allows us access to information well in advance as well as offer us opportunities to voice our ideas.

Our Trustee, in tandem with the two superintendents and PIAC (Parent Involvement Advisory Committee) representatives, is also working on a series of workshops involving ALL of our schools (admin, staff, parent and student representatives) with the aim of bringing our communities and stakeholders closer together. The three sessions, to be held in 2017, will be focused on three main topics-Wellness & Resiliency, Mathematics/Literacy & 21st Century Learning. Once we finalise all details, we will be extending an invitation to members of our community to participate. Please note that the objective of these sessions is not to bring in SAC Executive members but rather parents from each community who have previously not been engaged in school matters and would like to take the first steps.

Facilities Update:

Roofing/Solar:

We have been providing you with updates during the course of the past month regarding this ever-changing project. We still anticipate the completion date to be close to the end of November. The work conducted in the interior of the building (electrical room/roof cavity) has not interfered with the delivery of the programming in any of our classes.

Playground Slides: At our last meeting we disclosed that we were reassured by TDSB Facility Services that delivery would take place mid-October. This clearly did not happen. In fact we were receiving messages from facilities on the 17th asking us if the slides were delivered to our school. After much scrambling on our part, it was discovered that the whole process of purchasing the slides was halted on June 16th of last school year as a feasibility study needed to be conducted and 3 vendors needed to be contacted for quotes. THIS DID NOT HAPPEN. Fortunately we have been now able to expedite the process with all parties involved and a purchase requisition and subsequent order has now been placed and released. This essentially means that the two items will be purchased, delivered and installed at some point this year.

School Focus for 2016/17

Our school improvement plan continues to evolve. As was discussed at the WARD 8 Forum meeting (attended by several members of our SAC Executive), TDSB has allowed each school a great deal more flexibility in being able to choose relevant goals and paths to achieve these objectives. Our three goals will deal with issues of EQUITY, Health & Wellness and Academic Achievement. Once we have finalised our plan, we will share it in detail with all members of our community/post it on the website.

Professional Development for Staff

One of our ongoing goals is to ensure that our staff have opportunities to enhance their learning and thus improve their classroom practices. We have set a considerable percentage of our annual budget aside for this purpose. So far, a number of our teachers, ECE's and support staff have attended sessions on ORAL Communication in Classrooms, HOW TO ASK GOOD QUESTIONS as well as the use of APPS in kindergarten classrooms. We have also had a number of our staff attend Mental Health & Wellness training sessions. It is an expectation that any time someone attends a training session, they share their learning with colleagues either formally at division/staff meetings or informally through daily coplanning sessions.

Caring and Safe Schools

Our Committee has been enlarged with the addition of two parent representatives. We have provided our parents with regular updates regarding routine changes (example: inclement weather lunch routine/entry supervision routine). Should you have any concerns regarding any aspect of student safety/wellness, please contact school administration so that we could add the matter to our next mtg. agenda! PC Shari Spivak is our school liaison officer from 32 Div., who will be supporting us with school goals. She has already met with our junior students last week to discuss bullying and is scheduled for another 2 visits- Dec. 1st and Dec. 20th for our primary and kindergarten classes.

Wellness and Mental Health Committee

This is a committee that falls under the Caring and Safe Schools umbrella. It is the most active and involved committee, currently with 15 staff, Admin and 5 parent reps. The committee has led our last staff meeting with

an in-depth look at mindfulness and its impact on education and learning. Specifically, on meditation and its impact on brain function and wellness. Many teachers are implementing mindfulness activities in their classroom already, however, we wanted all teachers and support staff to experience this first hand and understand its importance. Resources and class strategies were shared by committee members. We are committed to developing staff awareness and experiences in wellness, by making it a priority item at every staff meeting this year.
