Changes to our School Day starting Monday

In our continued effort to improve school organization, safety and security for all, some changes will be taking place beginning this Monday, Dec. 12, 2022:

- 1. **Lunch:** While the lunch hour will remain the same (11:30 a.m. 12:30p.m.), lunch procedures will change. ALL students in our school will be eating their lunch from 11:30 to 11:50 a.m. indoors. Outdoor play time for ALL students will be from 11:50 12:30 p.m. This schedule allows for all supervisors to be outdoors with our students for maximum supervision. Two staff will be positioned indoors to monitor washroom procedures. This also allows for lunch time clubs and house leagues to take place without interruption. Please support us by ensuring your child brings lunch to school and avoid using services like Uber to bring lunch to school as this creates problems in the office which takes away from student safety. Any students that have permission to leave the building must time their return to school for a 12:30 p.m. start. Students will not be allowed into the building to eat their lunch after 11:50 a.m.
- 2. **Recess:** All students will engage in two recess breaks (9:55 to 10:10 a.m. and 1:55 to 2:10 p.m.)
- 3. **Dismissal:** ALL students will be dismissed at 3:15 p.m. Students in junior or intermediate grades who are picking up younger siblings, are asked to go directly to their respective doors for pick up following their dismissal. No student is to remain at the front of the school after dismissal. Any student not

- picked up by 3:30 p.m. will be brought to the office for safety purposes and parents will be called. Any student participating in after school activities, should proceed to those activities following their safe dismissal; otherwise, ALL students should be heading home following dismissal.
- 4. **Drop off of Grade 1/2 classes in the mornings:** Ms. Petrovski's, Ms. Vitalis' and Ms. Husband's students will enter via door 5 (the doors on the south side of the kindergarten fence) in the mornings only, where Ms. Minhas, Ms. Lee, Mr. Page and Ms. Thompson's classes line up. This way, all our grade 1 to 3 students will enter from the same door, which also supports ease of drop off when there are two or more children, of this age, in one family. Pick up doors will remain the same for all students to avoid congestion and support safe dismissal of students to their parents.
- 5. **Cell Phones:** Cell phones have become an increasingly unhealthy distraction for our students, as well as challenges with misuse resulting in unsafe situations. Parents, we need your help to remind students to either leave cell phones at home or put them away for safe keeping (back pack/locker). Cell phones are NOT to be seen or used in school (unless under the supervision of a teacher for educational purposes or medical reasons) or on school property during school hours (lunch and recesses included). If you need to reach your child, we encourage you to call the school. Our office staff will communicate your message to your child. Please refrain from calling or texting your child during school hours as this disrupts learning.

Parking

In order to allow for the safe pick up and drop off of our students that are bussed to and from school, as well as the safety of all children being picked up by parents, you will have noticed that the round about in front of our school is closed with pylons each morning from 8:20 to 8:45 and 3:00 to 3:40 p.m. If you wish to park to pick up your child, please do so at the community centre up the street from our school and walk to our school to pick up and drop off your children. This will avoid morning congestion on the street and unsafe U-turns.

On Saturday, Dec. 3rd, our team had the opportunity to demonstrate their robotics skills in a full day of events and competition.
