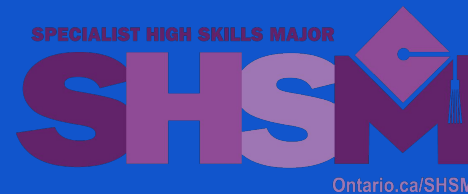
- **2 Credit Co-op** – Go out to a work placement for the morning (P1 + P2) or the afternoon (P3 + P4)

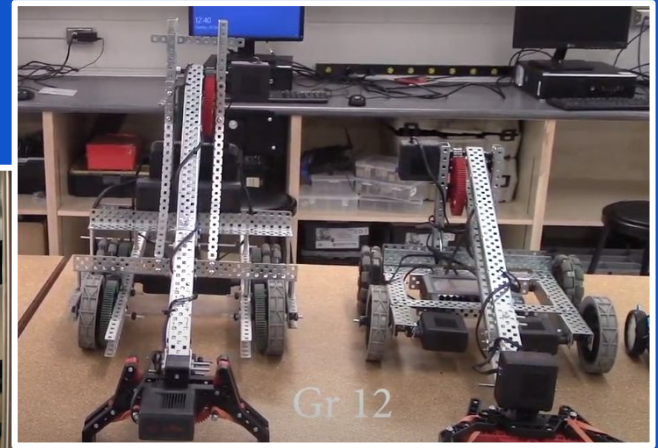
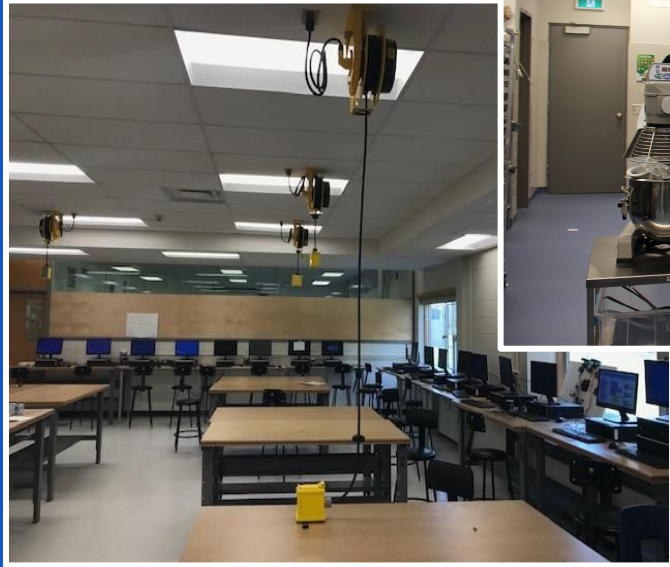

Elective: Tech / Business, Learning Strategies and Arts (Music, Drama, Visual Arts)

Semestered school

Full Time Child and Youth Worker, Social Work, Community Partnerships

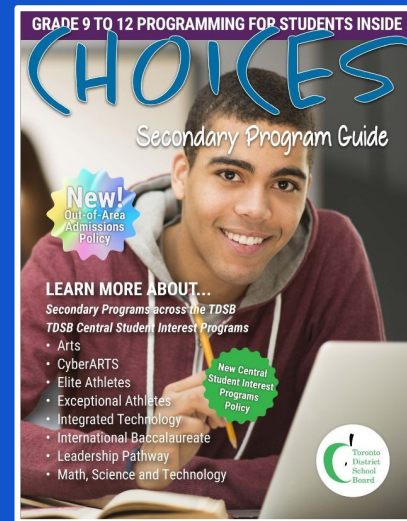


Choices

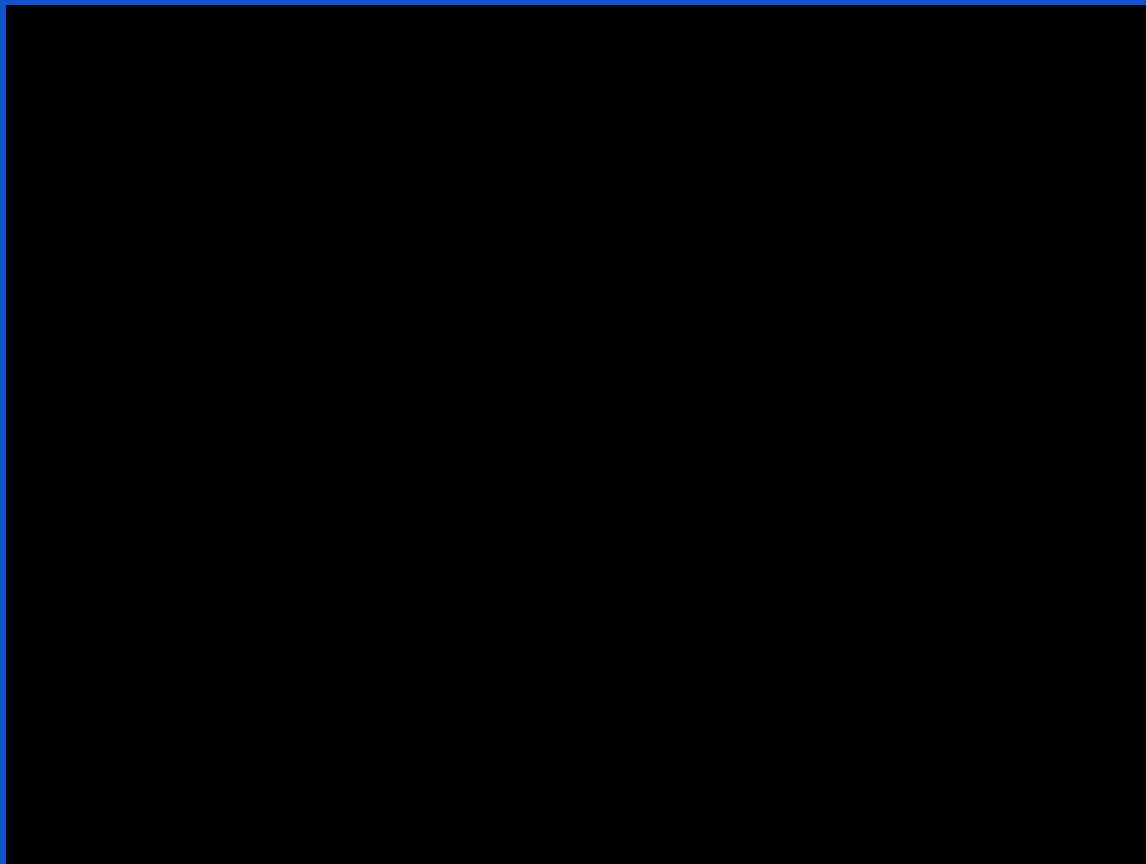
