



Our library is more than a place to check out amazing books - it's the heart of our school, a place where you and your students can experiment, explore, question, think critically and be creative. My hope is that our learning hub fuels curiosity and for it to be an engaging, dynamic, safe space where students work collaboratively. My goal is that students feel represented and develop a love for reading. Throughout this month, it has been a great pleasure welcoming classes to the library for orientations. Thank you for reinforcing respect for our learning environment and books within our library. Each class has been given 2 library passes. Feel free to send 2 students to the library during PM recess to enjoy some reading or activity time. Each month, we will have an Author of the Month. Some authors will be geared more towards primary students while others, junior students. We already have a very eager group of library helpers ready to help keep our library neat and organised! Every month, we will have a Lescon Library Challenge! This month the students did an amazing job creating book covers of their favourite books or their own made up books.

Partnering News: The juniors have been focusing on Digital Citizenship. Their culminating task is to present why being a responsible digital citizen is important to the grade 3 classes. Their next focus will be on Non-Fiction Text features. Our primary partnering will start the week of October 9th, starting with Ms. Creswell's grade 1/2 class. We will rotate through the primary classes month by month. Our first focus will be on the 7 Sacred Teaching of Indigenous People and writing sentences with details. I look forward to learning together with you and your class throughout the school year.
