Tech Tip: Virtually Amazing!

Virtual Reality (VR) is taking the world by storm! From video games, to life changing medical breakthroughs, and augmented amusement park experiences, everyone is capitalizing on this technology to rethink human experiences. Thanks to Google Cardboard, this experience has been made accessible to schools and students. Google Cardboards are literally made of cardboard and has been designed in such a



way that by putting in your Smartphone you can experience VR. You can purchase carapoards for less than \$20, but students can also build their own for a fun STEM challenge (it IS a challenge).

There are a myriad of applications that can be added to your Smartphone (Android or iOS) to experience VR at school and at home. The easiest is to use the YouTube app and search 360 videos. You'll find many great videos which you can watch through the Google Cardboard in VR by simply tapping the Google Cardboard icon. My favourite are the Google Spotlight Stories which are great short stories in various perspectives, and videos which takes us to see things we can't normally see (e.g. storm chasing, shark encounter). Other great VR apps include Google Streetview, With.in, Discovery VR, The New York Times VR App, Google Expeditions and Google Cardboard.

REMINDER: Protection of Anaphylactic Students

In our school, there are students with potentially life threatening forms of allergic reactions called Anaphylaxis, primarily to *peanuts/nuts/tree nuts*. Furthermore, we have updated our allergy list which now includes **sesame** and **seafood**. Please note that for regulatory purposes, Health Canada uses the following terms to describe **seafood**: fish (e.g., trout, salmon), shellfish (e.g., scallops, clams) and crustaceans (e.g., lobster, shrimp). If a child with an allergy comes in contact with even a small quantity of any of these items listed, the child may develop hives, swelling and/or have difficulty breathing.

Due to the severity of this condition, parents/caregivers are requested to ensure that lunches **do not contain peanut/nut/tree nut products.** Also, **please refrain from bringing in treats such as cakes, baked goods, donuts, cookies for birthdays and other celebrations because of the risks associated with these products for students with severe allergies**.


