#### Class Placements for 2020-2021

Class placement meetings for September 2020 school year will take place in late May/early June. The teachers and administration work collaboratively to determine the best class placement for all of our students. The following factors are considered:

-learning style/ needs of students

- -social skills and peer interactions/ gender combinations
- -teaching style
- -Ministry Guidelines regarding class size

The teachers who work with your child(ren) and all of the other children at their respective grade level, have the best perspective on these issues and will be working closely together with the administration to make good decisions for the students, teachers and Lillian Public School as a whole. Your input is valued and you are welcome to provide information that may assist your child's teacher in making these important decisions.

Appropriate details would include your child's placement history, the type of learner that you perceive they are, the style of instruction that you feel they would best benefit from and /or any relevant medical information. <u>Parents may not request a specific teacher</u> for their child(ren) and this type of request will not be accepted. Parents are asked to not include teacher names on any submitted correspondence, as information will be shared with the group at our placement meetings.
