## **Principal's Message**

Elementary Progress Reports will be sent home on Wednesday November 13<sup>th</sup>. As always, we appreciate the important role that you play in supporting student learning at home. I encourage you to attend the upcoming Parent Teacher Interviews on Thursday November 14<sup>th</sup> in the evening, and Friday November 15<sup>th</sup> in the morning. All parents will be offered an interview with the teacher. Please look for the teacher's invitation to this interview coming home shortly. I hope you will take the opportunity to further discuss with your child's teacher how we can work together to advance the learning skills, work habits, and academic progress of our students.

As well, for students who participate in International Languages classes after school on Thursdays at Lillian, the classes will be cancelled on Thursday November 14<sup>th</sup>due to the Parent Teacher Interviews. Please ensure that you make the appropriate arrangements to pick up your child either from school or the bus at the regularly scheduled time.

Our school spirit day this month will be Backwards Day on November 22<sup>nd</sup>. Please help your child participate by wearing something backwards. Parents of Junior Kindergarten students should have received information about the TDSB French Immersion program which starts in Senior Kindergarten. The deadline for applications is November 29<sup>th</sup>.

As our weather continues to change, please ensure you send your children to school with the appropriate outdoor clothing (warm jacket, gloves, hat) as students go outside three times each day. Thanks for your cooperation.

Finally, a reminder to parents that you cannot access classrooms after school hours. Once your child has been dismissed and staff have left the building, parents cannot re-enter to retrieve lost or forgotten items. You will need to wait until regular school hours the next day. This is a security issue. Thanks in advance for your cooperation.

#### **Transportation at Lillian- School Buses**

At Lillian PS, we have several students that utilize student transportation services every day. We work very hard to ensure the safety of all of our students and as such, when students are boarding the buses at the end of the day, attendance is taken and a head count is done to guarantee that everyone who is supposed to be on the bus has boarded.

If you are picking up your child from the school and they are not taking the bus on a given day, you must come to the office to sign them out. This is our tracking system to update the bus attendance lists. A note to the teacher or office at the beginning of the day is also helpful, but the sign out procedure must be completed in the office. If your child is supposed to attend a program, such as International Languages and you do not want them to attend, but would like them to take the bus home, you must inform the office in writing. When we do not have this information, it causes many delays for the buses as they must wait until we have the information before they can leave. Many of our buses have other routes after our school and this delay causes several other children to be late getting home from school.

Finally, if you wish to have another parent or family friend pick up your child from school, we to have this information directly from you- the parent. It is always best if a note can be sent in the morning; however, we understand that there are circumstances that arise throughout the day and may cause a change in pick up. If this is the case, please call the school office at 416-395-2660 and let us know the full name

of the person who will be picking up your child. The person should then report to the office where we will ask to see identification before releasing your child. Kindly note that if you are phoning the school office for any of the above situations, we ask that you speak directly with an adult and not leave a message with one of our student helpers.

Thank-you for your support in helping us ensure that our transportation Program runs safely and smoothly for everyone.

### PLEASE READ: STUDENT DROP-OFF/PICK UP

#### Drop- Off:

- **Students should not arrive at school before 8:26 am**. There is no supervision prior to this time. When students arrive, they should go directly to the backyard of the school.
- All students should wait for their teacher in their class lines at their assigned entry door when the bell rings at 8:41am. Students should not use the front doors for entry.
- NO parking-NO drop-off from the school parking lot- it is very dangerous and we have had a number of "near misses".
- NO stopping or parking in the bus loop. It is a "bus loading zone" and disrupts the buses.
- NO stopping or parking at the front of the school in the "bus loading zone". It makes it hard for our buses to drop-off and it is against the law.

Pick-up:

- Students being picked up early for appointments must be signed out from the office before 2:45pm. There will be no sign -outs between 2:45-3:15pm.
- All students will be dismissed from their proper dismissal doors at 3:10 (kindergarten) and 3:15 (grades 1 to 5). Please wait by the assigned door for your child to be dismissed.
- NO parking- NO pick-up from the school parking lot- It is a staff parking lot, with minimal space. On Thursdays there has already been a problem this year with our International languages teachers not being able to park in our lot.
- NO WALKING through the school parking lot- it is very dangerous and we have had some "close calls".
- NO stopping or parking in the bus loop. It is a "bus loading zone" and disrupts the buses.
- No stopping or parking at the front of the school in the "bus loading zone". It makes it hard for our buses to pick-up and it is against the law.

Thank-you for helping to keep our community of children and adults safe. Always think safety!



#### French Programs Application Deadline

For families interested in the Toronto District School Board's French Immersion we offer an online process for applying to:

- Early French Immersion (EFI) which begins in Senior Kindergarten;

We guarantee an offer of placement in the program (not a specific school) to all on-time applicants. Transportation is provided as per the Board's Transportation policy.

The timelines for applying for these programs for September 2020 are:

- Applications for Early French Immersion (for a Junior Kindergarten aged child), must be completed online between November 4, 2019 and November 29, 2019.

Offers of placement within your chosen program will be made to all on-time applicants in the weeks following the close of the application window.

Please note: families with an older sibling currently in a French program are still required to complete an online application for the new student.

For parents who may decide that Early French Immersion is not feasible at this time, a second entry point to French Immersion will be available in Gr. 4 (Middle Immersion). Beginning in September 2021, the Grade 4 Entry program will be Middle French Immersion. The Middle French Immersion program will offer 100% instruction in French for Grades 4-5 and 75% instruction in French for Grades 6,7 and 8. Students may continue the French Immersion Program in secondary school and may complete the certificate of Bilingual Studies, French Immersion. Interested families may submit an online application to this program in January of the year the students are in Grade 3.

#### Remembrance Day
