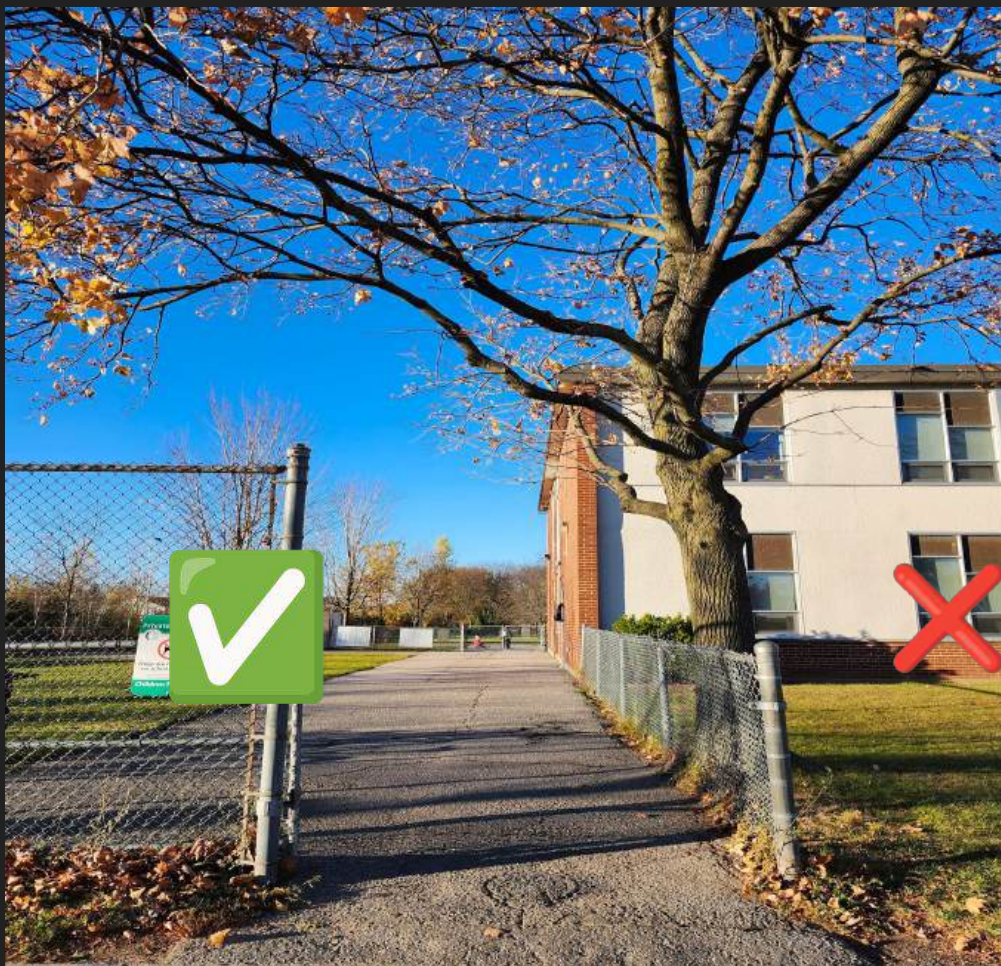

Christmas is celebrated on December 25th each year. Depending on where in the world one lives, Christmas is celebrated differently.

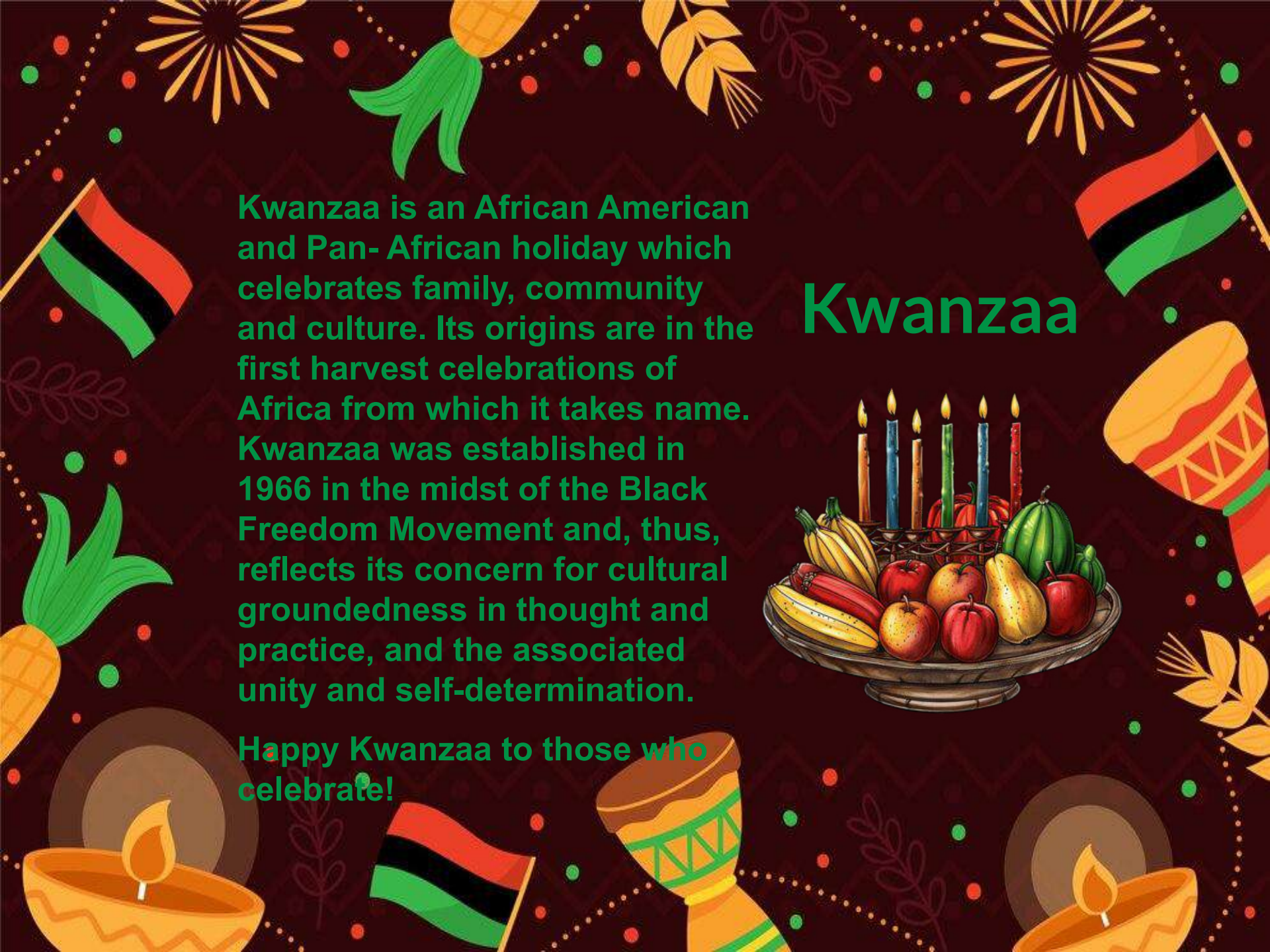
