Dear Families:

Math is everywhere, and you can help your children make connections between what they are learning in school and everyday experiences at home and in the community, such as at the store, cooking at home, or managing money.

Here are some ideas about how math can be part of your regular day-to-day routine:

- 1. **Math games** Math puzzles and games can show that math is fun. They also require trial-and-error thinking, enhance numeracy and logical thinking, and promote discussion.
- 2. **Math on TV** Watch educational television programs. Many offer websites with activities to do together, including free games, apps, math crafts, and songs.
- 3. **Math at the grocery store** You can talk to your child about how to weigh fruit on a scale or how to estimate the total cost of items as you fill your cart.
- 4. **Math with money** Help your child manage money by creating a budget together or saving to make a special purchase. Or you could go shopping together and help with estimating the amount of a purchase, calculating the tax and checking the change.
- 5. **Math in computer games** If your child enjoys the computer, introduce them to fun and educational web-based games and activities.
- 6. **Math in the kitchen** Bake, cook and prepare food with your child. There are many great math opportunities in the kitchen, such as measuring ingredients.

The online CCAT 7 assessment is AODA-friendly, and assistive technology like Read and Write can be used to support students. The test administration window is between **Tuesday**, **October 10**, **2023 and Friday**, **October 27**, **2023**. Please include the specific date(s) for test administration for your school in the <u>CCAT 7 Parent/Guardian/Caregiver Letter</u> that is to be sent home to parents/guardians/caregivers of all Grade 3 students including students in a Virtual Learning class.

At Lynnwood Heights, we will be administering the assessment on October 17, 18 and 24th.

September 30 is National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.


Together we recognize the legacy of Canada's residential school system and continue to learn the many truths of these institutions.
