Semester 2 starts Feb. 2 – What To Expect!

- Students will be able to access their timetable through their SchoolConnects app at the end of the day on Feb. 1; timetables will also be emailed to students.
- We will no longer have staggered dismissals at lunch or after school.
- Virtual students may be scheduled for a class through another school; if that is the case, the course will not appear on their timetable or on the SchoolConnects app. Students will be contacted directly by their Guidance Counselor for information about the course.
- Students attending in-person should arrive with a lock. Students will receive their locker number in their period 1 class.
- Lunch is still 45 min, but the TDSB has indicated that they will revisit the length of lunch later in the semester (hopefully when some TPH restrictions for schools are adjusted).
- All TDSB schools are following the same timetable structure and schedule.
- The library will be available for students during lunch and for students who have spares during period 2 or 3.
- Students who did not opt to be virtual for Sem 2 are expected to attend inperson.
- Students who are absent due to illness or isolation will be provided with asynchronous learning materials through their teacher's online class. Live streaming of lessons will not be available for most classes.

Pop-Up Vaccine Clinics in East Toronto January 31 to February 6

First and second dose eligibility:

- Open to individuals aged 5+ who live and/or go to school in any "<u>M" postal code</u>. Children must be at least 5 years old at the time of vaccination.
- Children aged 5-11 can get their second dose 21 days after the first dose with informed consent from their parent/guardian.

Third (booster) dose eligibility:

Open to individuals aged 18+ who live and/or go to school in any "M" postal code. Individuals must be at least 18 years old at the time of vaccination.

Health card not required if you do not have one. You can bring an ID or document with your name, like a driver's license, passport, utility bill, pay stub, student ID or report card. **Even If you do not have lhese documents, we encourage you to altend one of lhese** clinics. Our team will do heir best to help get you vaccinated.

GRADE 12 REMINDERS

Many of our Grade 12 students have completed applications to post-secondary programs. Here are a few reminders to students who are have received or are awaiting offers from post-secondary institutions:

Ensure you check conditions of any offers you have received and ensure you are on track to fulfil them (ex. You may be required to complete certain courses, achieve a minimum mark, etc.) Please thoroughly read any documentation sent to you by the post-secondary school.

If you need assistance with this, please reach out to your guidance counsellor.The next transmission dates to OUAC and OCAS are coming up. Once these dates have passed, please log into your OUAC and/or OCAS accounts to ensure that all of your academic records are up to date and accurate.

This new transmission will include final semester 1 marks. The transmission dates are February 11th for OCAS and February 10th for OUAC.

For Grade 12s who have yet to apply to post-secondary school: College applications are ongoing, however the equal consideration deadline for competitive college programs is February 1st, 2022. Please click<u>here</u> for more information on Highly Competitive college programs.

Although the OUAC deadline has passed, some university programs may still be open and accepting applications. Students may visit the <u>Browse Programs</u> section of the OUAC website to see what programs are available for applications. Students who missed the OUAC deadline but still wish to apply should reach out to their guidance counsellor for assistance.

PRIOR LEARNING ASSESSMENT AND RECOGNITION 2021-2022 Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) is the formal evaluation and credit-granting process whereby students may obtain credits for prior learning. Prior learning includes the knowledge and skills that students have acquired, in both formal and informal ways, outside secondary school. Students may have their knowledge and skills evaluated against the expectations outlined in provincial curriculum policy documents in order to earn credits towards the secondary school diploma.

The 2021/2022 PLAR Challenge process will kick off with a Virtual PLAR Information Session for Families on January 17, 2022. Please note that the PLAR is a central TDSB process and decisions are not made at the school level.



STUDENT SUCCESS TIP - BINDER ORGANIZATION IN SEMESTER 2!

For Grade 9 and 10 students, this is your first time having 4 courses per day! The 4 course Semester schedule will take some getting used to but one thing that can really help is having a properly organized set of binders. Follow these steps to get your binders ready for Semester 2!

Step 1 - Choose Your Binder System

Student Success recommends having 2 binders for each school day. Binder #1 will have your course notes for your two morning classes, Binder #2 will contain notes for your afternoon classes. This Mathematics way, you can visit your locker at lunch to drop off your AM binder and pick up your PM binder! 1.5" binders should be a great size! Be sure to choose different colours!



Step 2 - Use Dividers

Dividers can help you easily separate the notes for the two courses in each binder. Be sure to label them!

Step 3 - Add Lined Paper

It's helpful to always have extra lined paper at the back of your binder in case your teachers would like you to take notes.

Step 4 - Finishing Touches

Adding a calendar at the front of each binder makes it easy to write down homework/ important dates for each class

Use plastic sleeves for notes or handouts that have not been punched or miscellaneous

sheets that you don't want to lose (Hint: Student Success has many plastic sleeves for you to use!) Credit Recovery Add dates to your notes. If your binder pops open and papers get out of order, you can easily put them back in the correct place.

CREDIT RECOVERY - REMOTE NIGHT SCHOOL

Students who were not successful in earning credits in Semester 1 (or even last year) may be able to earn their credit through Credit Recovery. Credit Recovery is offered in Semester 2 through Remote Night School. Enrolled students attend night school 1 night per week (or 2 nights if recovering 2 credits) from 6:30 - 9:30pm.

Credit Recovery may be considered as an alternative to re-taking a course.
