MALVERN STUDENTS IMPRESS AT THE CANHACK CHALLENGE!



How did you spend your March break? Two teams of dedicated Malvern students spent much of their March break honing their hacking skills in a cybersecurity competition called the **CanHack Challenge** [<https://dmz.ryerson.ca/canhack/>].

CanHack is a national cybersecurity competition for high school students sponsored by RBC and Ryerson University. The competition is a team-based, "capture the flag" style challenge that runs for 2 weeks (March 14th to 29th). Hundreds of teams from across Canada participate each year!

Malvern students have had great success this year with various Computing Competitions, and CanHack was no exception! Our top team placed 29th (out of 340 teams) and was led by Dennis Kaydalov (team members: Clarke Needles, Ron Gould, David Mori, and Logan Peyton), and our second team placed 49th, led by Zoe Reichert (team members: Julia Sinclair, Max Braunstein, Virag Takacs, and Joshua Guest). It was a lot of work, but everyone learned a lot and had fun doing it.

A Day In Aviation will require students commit to three 2-hour sessions. These sessions will be:

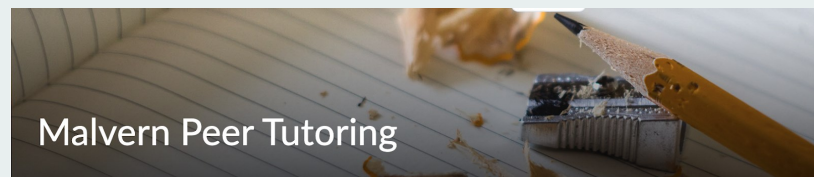

BECOMING AN ANTI-RACIST

Last week, Alexis Dawson joined Malvern parents to discuss the book, *So You Want to Talk About Race*, by Ujeoma Oluo. The conversation was honest and thought-provoking.

After reading Ujeoma Oluo's book, and engaging in discussions in Alexis Dawson, and members of our school community, I feel even more committed to my learning, and to continuing our anti-racism work with parents, staff and students.

I think everyone should read this book!

In school, we talk to students about the importance of *being* an anti-racist.

I am an anti-racist. The statement is a powerful one as it focusses on activism. It is also a statement that ought to replace, "I'm not racist" as it is laden with defensiveness, and when followed with "but..." it will most certainly be a racially insensitive, if not racist, comment.

Perhaps a more accurate statement is, ***I am learning how to be an anti-racist,*** or ***I am seeking to be an anti-racist.*** It's a subtle shift, but an important one. Being an anti-racist should not be about who you are, but about who you are becoming.

Becoming an anti-racist is about committing to an on-going process of learning, unlearning, interrupting, confronting, reflecting, respecting, acting.

Repeat.

The process of becoming an anti-racist is not linear.
The process of becoming an anti-racist is on-going.

At Malvern, we continue to take steps towards eliminating all forms of hate, racism, bias and discrimination, including changing what we teach and how we teach; updating the classrooms and hallways to reflect diversity; engaging with our student groups to promote equity & inclusion; and inviting guest speakers to facilitate workshops and discussions with staff, students and parents.

There is always more to learn about ourselves and about others and there is always more action to be taken.

ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL LITERACY TEST (OSSLT)

Successful completion of the OSSLT remains a graduation requirement for any student who is not set to graduate by June, 2022.

Last semester, Malvern administered the assessment to all grade 11 students and 94.7% were successful.

Those who are not yet successful will have another opportunity to complete the assessment in the spring.

This semester, all grade 10 students will complete the assessment in May.

Students will be given preparation materials and instruction in their classes prior to the assessment.

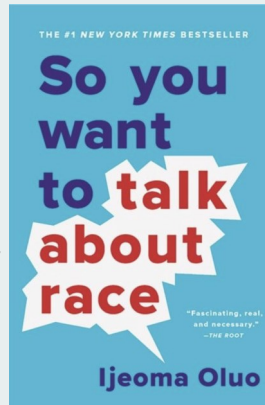
