

Summer School

Registration is ongoing for July and August summer school. Some programs are filling up quickly and registration for July full credit programs WILL close on June 10 - we encourage you to register now. Schulich Business Excellence Academy

The Schulich Business Excellence Academy is a summer business education and mentorship program supporting approximately 100 Grade 10 or 11 high school students across Ontario. The program targets all students from under-represented communities with a focus on Black and Indigenous communities. It is free, and will consist of evening online sessions in July. TORONTO REHABILITATION INSTITUTE DESIGN PROGRAM

The Summer TRI (Toronto Rehabilitation Institute) Design Program is an experiential learning program for grade 11 and 12 students. TRI Design Program has an equity focus as it's designed for students that face systemic barriers. The summer program lasts four weeks and within the program students are provided an opportunity to explore science, technology, and research through developing their own research project, as well as connecting with researchers, professionals and graduate students. The overall goal of the program is to provide interested students with an opportunity to explore science and research, as well as build their capacity (e.g., communication skills, critical thinking skills, etc.).

The program runs July 4-29 from 9:00 am-3:15 pm, and students will receive one 4M course credit (SNC4M) as part of the program.

Malvern's Drama Club


The Drama Club is proud to present Stephen Gregg's "This is a Test".

This one-act play is a delightful comedy about how everything could go wrong on the day of an important exam. And we mean, *everything*!


We will present two shows on Wednesday, June 22nd: a lunch time and after school performance.


FROM THE EQUITY & SOCIAL JUSTICE CLASSES

TDSB CHECK-IN SURVEY

As we begin to look ahead to September 2022, the Research Department of the TDSB is gathering information from parents/caregivers and students about student mental health and well-being. As well, we are interested in what conditions and practices supported student learning success during this past school year. During the week of May 30th, we will be asking parents/caregivers (JK to Grade 12) and students (a sample of Grades 7 to 12) to complete a short, online survey to share their thoughts and experiences. The survey is anonymous and should take approximately 10 minutes to complete.

Students will be given an opportunity in class to complete the survey, which is anonymous. Students can also fill out the survey on a break or at home.

On May 30, an email was sent to all parents/guardians/caregivers of students who are currently registered for <u>Virtual Learning for the 2022-2023 school year</u> to inform them of the opportunity to request a withdrawal from Virtual Learning and return to In-Person Learning. The request to withdraw will take place between June 6-10.


E-LEARNING GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

The Ontario Ministry of Education has introduced a new graduation requirement for secondary students to complete two e-Learning credits as part of the 30 credits required for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). It applies **only** to students who entered Grade 9 on or after September 1, 2020 which means that they are now in Grade 9 or Grade 10.

Students may withdraw/opt out of this new requirement and graduate with an OSSD

Last month, Malvern sent home a survey (to grade 9 and 10 parents only) for parents/students to indicate a preference for courses that may be offered as an e-Learning course. An Opt-Out form was sent to grade 9 and 10 parents via Permission Click. There was very little interest in taking an elearning course for the 2022/23 school year so Malvern will not be offering this option for grade 10 & 11 students. Students may still take virtual courses through summer school or eLearning day school (subject to availability).
