



### From the Experiential Learning Department

The Beaver Computing Challenge (BCC) is a prestigious national competition run by the University of Waterloo each November. It is a problem-solving contest with a focus on computational and logical thinking skills. Questions are inspired by topics in computer science but only require comfort with concepts found in the mathematics curricula common to all provinces.

This year, over 10,000 of the keenest grade 9 and 10 computer science students from across Canada participated, including a group of 13 students from Mr Rao's Computing Club and our BTT10 classes. Our students trained hard to get ready for it and achieved some amazing results!

The preliminary results show that 6 of our students will earn awards of distinction for scoring in the top 25% of all participants, and the rest of our competitors were very close to achieving this honour. These are the best results Malvern has ever had in this competition (last year we had 3 students earn awards of distinction). The names of our top students will be published in the December newsletter once the results are official.

As you can see everyone had a good time and really enjoyed participating together.

Canadian Screenwriter and Filmmaker, Laura Stubbs, led an inspiring talk for students in Media Studies about women in film as well as exciting and unique careers in film and television (e.g. pyrotechnician, set decorator, colorist).

She also worked with students and provided feedback on their pre-production packages for their short films. It was an amazing learning experience to learn and receive feedback from an industry professional.

The students in the Introduction to Anthropology, Psychology and Sociology (APS) class had the fantastic opportunity of receiving two guest speakers to our class who came to share their knowledge and expertise in the psychology field.

Our first speaker was Jennifer Kapler who is a psychologist that works both in the TDSB and private practice. She spoke to us about her psychological approaches such as CBT (Cognitive Behavioural Therapy) and ACT (Acceptance and Commitment Therapy). She also spoke about the diagnosis and treatment of anxiety, depression and more.

Our second guest speaker was Dr. Steven Minuk, a psychoanalyst who practises privately in Toronto. Dr. Minuk was able to share many of the techniques he uses to explore the individual's mind, such as dream analysis.

Through these presentations, the students were able to learn about many of the different ways that psychologists work to understand behaviour and treat mental illness.

Therapy can vary from psychologist to psychologist and there are different treatments based on clients' needs. Most importantly, students were able to talk and reflect about some of the stigmas that are associated with mental illness.

By understanding that it is ok to talk about the way we feel and accepting that all of us can benefit from help (such as therapy), we will be able to fight these stigmas more effectively.

The APS classes recently visited the Aga Khan Museum and learned about Islamic art and culture. Students engaged in art-based learning that helped to broaden their understanding of the art of Muslim civilizations.

They also saw that Islamic artistic production varies across time and geographical boundaries. One of the goals of the trip was for students to understand that there is a wide range of Islamic art and that the diversity of many Muslim societies in the past helps us understand of diversity and plurality in Canadian and global societies. Students were also able to participate in a simulation activity where they explored how luxury goods and resources were shared and traded around the ancient world.

All in all it was a day full of fun and learning!
