E-LEARNING AND NIGHT SCHOOL

e-Learning and Night School registration for Semester 2 will be opening soon.

OCAS/OUAC

A reminder to any grade 12 students who have applied to post-secondary that marks have now been transferred to OCAS (college) and OUAC (university). All students are encouraged to check their courses and marks through their accounts on these websites.

NOTE: for the new OUAC website - students should look at "My Supporting Documents-Academic Information", then click the eye icon. Under "Academic Information Received", click the eye icon again. Scroll down through "My High School Information" to double check courses and marks.

Stay and Learn Grant

The Ontario Learn and Stay Grant provides funding for students studying in nursing, practical nursing, paramedic and medical laboratory programs in priority communities in Ontario. This program:

- requires you to work in the region where you studied
- responds to labour market needs, including in health care
- helps underserved and growing communities get the workers they need for in-demand professions

The grant will cover the cost of:

- tuition
- compulsory fees
- books
- other direct educational costs (for example, supplies & equipment)

Post-Secondary Opportunities Gathering for Indigenous Students

The Urban Indigenous Education Centre is honoured to host a Post-Secondary & Trades Fair for First Nations, Métis and Inuit students across the Toronto District School Board on Wednesday, December 6, 2023.

Indigenous students will have the opportunity to:

- Meet university, college and trades program representatives face-to-face, and engage with Indigenous representatives, mentors and alumni:
- Inquire about valuable information on programs, admissions, scholarships/bursaries, and support services;
- Learn how to access multiple options for Post-Secondary pathways;
- Find out about employment opportunities for summer and beyond.

University of Toronto Summer Mentorship Program

The Summer Mentorship Program (SMP) gives high school students of Indigenous or African ancestry a chance to explore health sciences at the University of Toronto over four weeks in July. Students can get more information and apply through the <u>website</u>. The first application deadline is January 12, 2024.

Schulich Builders

Schulich Builders are scholarships for students enrolling in an eligible, full-time skilled trades program at a participating college in Ontario. Every high school in Ontario can nominate up to five students for this scholarship. Ten colleges award a total of 100 scholarships annually. Each college will award ten scholarships:

- Five for one-year certificate programs
- Five for two-year diploma programs
- Valued at \$40,000 (\$20,000 per academic year), these scholarships support the costs of tuition, tools and living expenses.

Selection Criteria

Students must meet the following criteria to be considered for the scholarship:

- Strong work ethic and character, as evidenced by one letter of recommendation by someone directly connected to the student, preferably:
 - High school staff member
 - Employer Co-worker
 - Community organization
- Financial need as determined by each college admission department

Interested students should notify their Guidance Counselor that they wish to seek school nomination by Friday, February 23rd 2024.
