Graduated Students	
Commencement ceremony is booked for Dec 17 <sup>th</sup> at Parkview Manor	
and hopes are that this will go ahead as a face to face ceremony.	
Alternative planning will be worked on in combination with the school	
staff, students and School Council as needed.	
Scholarships and awards are still being worked on with donors and/or	
teaching staff and will be finalized by Sept/October.	
Diplomas have not been distributed by the MOE at this time.	
Distribution of Voorbooks for graduating students and last upper's	
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students is still being considered with respect to safety.	
Sandy provided us with school photos that illustrated social distancing	
efforts within the classrooms, school grounds, washrooms and	
computer labs. Students will be asked to wipe down desks/computers	
before and after each use (sanitizer and wipes are available)	
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Community members who live around Malvern have raised concerns	
about late night use of the new paved parking lot by young people for	
skateboarding and recreation – Sandy is working with Board security	
and the community to address this.	
Parents should be aware that students are being invited to attend a	
ski trip in March organized by Breakaway Tours – this is not a Malvern	
sanctioned event nor a Malvern supervised event. At this time, there	

are no planned field trips planned by Malvern or the TDSB.

Grade 9's. New parents and students were welcomed to the school. A virtual orientation has been emailed out to all new grade 9 students – includes an orientation to the school layout, welcome by teachers, peer leaders and guidance counsellors and ideas on how to get involved in the school community. Grade 9 students will have the school to themselves on the first 2 days of school from 8:45 to 9:45 and there will be school staff on hand to welcome them and direct them to their classrooms.

### **Class Size**

Malvern has been able to "cap" their classes to 15 students or less with the exception of Computing Science which has 18 students.

### **Teaching Staff**

Malvern has a fairly high percentage of students who chose in-person learning (only 9% opted for Virtual School), resulting in a very small impact on teacher reassignment (3.5 positions). 9 Malvern teachers volunteered/requested to teach at the Virtual School. Malvern has been assigned 5 teachers who were from other TDSB schools who lost staff allocation due to lower in-school enrolment. Some students may see ZZ as their teacher name – those teachers' names are in the process of being updated in the system. Their names should be refected in student timetables shortly.

#### Malvern Emails

Some grade 9 students/parents reported that they are not receiving school emails. This may be for a number of reasons: students who are transferred from another school board may take longer to get set up into the TDSB or students may need to reset their TDSB passwords. It was suggested that students/parents contact the TDSB IT support system.

She suggested that this is the preferred method rather than calling the Guidance Counsellors by phone. Extra-Curriculars and Clubs These are vitally important to school life and efforts will be made to offer virtual ECs and clubs. Stay tuned. Student Council (SAC) Student Council will go forward and it will be important for students to have a voice in this year's school year. Elections will be coming up – stay tuned. Registration Fee There will be no student registration fees this year as there are no costs for sports, ECs, field trips, etc. A \$25.00 per student fee is being considered for this year's Yearbook and the school will partner with School Council regarding supporting this initiative financially. Masks & Safety Students will receive 2 masks on the first day of school (both black, one with the Malvern logo). Students may also choose to use their own masks or disposable ones will be also available at the school. Desks and computer labs are clearly designated and spaced apart - students will clean their desks before and after use (sanitizer and wipes are available). Only 2 students will be allowed to be in the washroom at one time. The school is divided into 4 quadrants with their own entrance/exits, washrooms and classrooms. Students will be given 2 15 minute breaks while in class. They are encouraged to bring their own water bottles, laptops and snacks.
