-	Important to arrive on time and prepared for school every day	
-	Responsibility of all staff and students to take care of the	
	school- not yet a problem but being proactive to make sure	
	this does not become an issue	
-	Scholarships and awards- award numbers were reduced last	
	time from what has been awarded in the past. Aaron reviewed this with teachers and they came up with	
	recommendations. Teachers suggested a consideration of	
	bringing in a new award concerning equity for a student who	
	shows this in the school and the community. Still under	
	review.	
-	Cell phone use – continues to be an issue. TDSB is looking	
	at bringing in stricter rules surrounding this. Malvern will wait	
	for TDSB to present this new policy to the schools. In the	
	meantime, please remind students to not use phones during	
	class time. Asking parents to not text kids during school time	
	unless it is an emergency. Timing of this new policy from the TDSB is unknown. Michelle Aarts, our Trustee will be	
	discussing this at the next meeting.	
_	Exams begin Jan 24, 5 day exam schedule. All exams will	
	be completed within first 4 days. January 31 st morning is	
	exam review, afternoon is an opportunity for credit rescue.	
	Feb 1 st PA day. Feb 2 nd is the first day of semester 2 – Day

-	School marks are based on 70% term work, 30% culminating	
	work and/or exam. It is up to the teacher how the 30% will	
	be split between culminating and exam. For Grade 9 math	
	students they will write their EQAO during exam time. For second semester, it will likely be part of the exam time.	
_	We have had three openings filled for teachers and these	
	new teachers will be allocated in second semester.	
-	Question online if vaping has gotten better – no vapes have	
	been confiscated in the last couple of weeks

 Teacher/Staff Representative Report Cell phone usage is still a problem. Students are not putting them away. Younger grades are a bigger problem than the older grades. Asking parents to continue to ask students to put their phones away during class time. Punctuality is still an issue in the morning and after lunch. Culminating and exams, students are stressed. If kids are feeling overwhelmed, encourage them to reach out to the teachers as exam review will be happening over the next week. Culminating work is meant to be done in class, as much as possible. It should be the student's own work. Absences for culminating and exams, require a doctors note in order to be rescheduled. Medical note must state that the culminating work or exam had to be missed due to the medical illness. If the conflict is a school sport event, then they can make up the time missed Question regarding students using AI, there is a software that assists the teachers with noting plagiarism however this is more difficult with reports created by AI.
