<u>*NEW - Kindergarten Registration Begins in</u> January

Registration for TDSB Kindergarten programs begins in January this school year. We look forward to welcoming our new Junior Kindergarten students in September!

To attend Junior Kindergarten in September, children must turn four years old by December 31, 2025. To register for Senior Kindergarten, children must be five years old by December 31, 2025. The registration process will be completed online and a meeting will also be booked with the school office staff to



complete the registration process. For more information about the

Kindergarten Registration Begins on Monday, January 6th. <u>Once you complete your registration forms</u> <u>online, the office will review the registration forms</u> <u>and will call you when they are ready to book an</u> <u>appointment with you to complete the registration</u> <u>process.</u>

Our office staff will let you know what documents you will need to have available for your registration appointment and are also able to provide guidance



with completing the registration forms online if you have any questions.

Early French Immersion Program/Application Process The Early French Immersion program begins in Junior Kindergarten (JK). For September 2025 entry, **the deadline to apply was November 29th.** Applications that are submitted after this deadline will be marked as late and accommodated if space in the program is available.

In February, only those families who applied by the deadline and have accepted an offer of placement for their child via the <u>central application process</u> can register in Early French Immersion.

Out-Of-Area Admissions Process

Online applications for both elementary and secondary <u>Out-of-Area Admissions</u> opens on January **6, 2025**. This is the process whereby students can apply to attend a school outside of the school designated to serve their home address. Acceptance is subject to space availability and transportation is the responsibility of the applicant. The Elementary application deadline is January **31 at 4 p.m.** and the Secondary application deadline is January **24 at 4 p.m.**

Middle French Immersion (Grade 4 Entry) <u>Application Process</u>

For families interested in the Toronto District School Board's system-wide French Immersion Program, we offer an online process to apply for Middle French Immersion (begins in Grade 4). To apply to the Middle French Immersion Program for September 2025, applications must be completed online between January 6 and 31, 2025. Families with an older sibling currently in a Middle French Immersion program are still required to complete an online application for the new student. Elementary Alternative Schools Online Application Process

The TDSB offers a wide range of <u>Elementary</u> <u>Alternative Schools</u> available to students. The application process is managed centrally and includes an online application form. The online application for admission for September 2025 open on **Monday**, January 6, 2025, and will close at **4:00 p.m. Friday**, January 31, 2025.

Tamil Heritage Month


Tamil Heritage Month is proudly recognized during the month of January at Toronto District School Board (TDSB) since January 2016. It has also been marked across the province of Ontario since March 2004 with the implementation of the <u>Tamil Heritage</u> <u>Month Act, 2014</u>. Further, Tamil Heritage Month is also formally recognized nationally since January 2016 by the passing of a motion which reads, *That, in the opinion of the House, the government should recognize the contributions that Tamil-Canadians have made to Canadian society, the richness of the Tamil language and culture, and the importance of educating and reflecting upon Tamil heritage for future generations by declaring January, every year, Tamil Heritage Month.*

This year, the theme for Tamil Heritage Month is from a quotation by an influential Tamil philosopher named Kaniyan Pungundranar:

Kinship: யாதும் ஊரே யாவரும் கேளிர் // Yaadhum Oore Yaavarum Kelir

To us, all towns are one, and all people are our kin

The theme of kinship and interconnectedness of all people is important to Tamil people. It emphasizes



the idea that regardless of where we come from, we are all part of a larger family. This theme encourages us to celebrate diversity and foster unity within communities, highlighting that our differences enrich our shared human experience.

Toronto has the

largest Tamil population outside of the South Asian subcontinent with thousands of TDSB students and staff members who identify as Tamil. Throughout the month of January as we recognize Tamil Heritage Month, we encourage you to explore various aspects of kinship—whether through family ties, friendships, or community connections.

To mark Tamil Heritage Month at the TDSB various educational opportunities will be offered to students to further learn about the history, customs, and traditions.

<u>Traffic Safety Tips: Help Make This A</u> <u>Safe Winter Season</u>

During the winter season, we know that severe weather will be part of our daily lives for the next few months. While traffic safety is an important matter all year long, this is a particularly good time to review what we can do to keep students safe. The need to be aware and alert at all times, on any road, and even in the most routine circumstances is key to traffic safety. This applies to students and drivers alike. Road conditions can be challenging in the winter months. So to those of us who drive, please take extra care on the roads and in parking lots, especially in areas where children might be present.

School staff periodically review street and traffic safety with students. Parents can help reinforce these safety messages with children at home. Below are some tips that might be helpful to review.

Stop, look, and listen for traffic. Only cross at corners and crosswalks. Make contact with drivers. eye Walk on the right side of the crosswalk. Wear appropriate footwear to reduce the chances of slipping.

Never run out into the street or into the parking lot. Obey all crossing signals and signage, including directions from crossing guards on duty at intersections.

Cross only if it is safe and clear to do so. Walk on the sidewalks, not on the road, in the parking lot or on the edge of the curb. Where there are no sidewalks, walk as far away from traffic as possible, facing traffic. The safety of our students is always a top priority. Let's work together to make the winter season safe so we can enjoy all it has to offer

<u>Severe Weather Procedure and Student</u> <u>Transportation</u>

From time to time, it may be necessary to cancel student transportation, classes and/or programs due to severe weather. On rare occasions, severe weather makes it necessary



to close schools, administrative offices or sites.

With approximately 238,000 students in our schools and sites each day, any decision to cancel buses, classes and/or programs or to close sites can have a significant impact on thousands of families across Toronto. This decision is not taken lightly. When schools remain open on days with inclement weather, parents/guardians make the final decision on whether to send their children to school and they can keep children home from school if they so choose.
