Earth Day 2024


On Monday, April 22nd, it is Earth Day. Earth Day is a celebration of the Earth and our environment. We are all connected to the Earth and therefore, we all have a



April is Sikh Heritage Month @ the TDSB

Sikh Heritage Month has proudly been recognized at the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) during the month of April since 2016. The TDSB became the first school board in Canada to designate April of each year as Sikh Heritage Month. This designation matches the recognition by the Province of Ontario that proclaimed the Sikh Heritage Month Act in

December 2013, and the recognition proclaimed by the Government of Canada on April 30, 2019. Sikh Heritage Month is recognized nationally across Canada.

Sikh Canadians have lived in Ontario since the turn of the twentieth century. They have made significant contributions to the growth and



prosperity of Ontario and their traditions and culture continues to be a vibrant part of every aspect of life of Canadians today.

This year's the Sikh Heritage Month's theme is *Chardi Kala (The Positive and Uplifted State of Mind)*. According to Sikh beliefs, *Chardi Kala* is a state of mind that radiates positive energy, optimistic attitude, strong confidence, and virtuosity. With true belief in the supreme power of the Almighty and the oneness of humanity, this state of mind can pave a way for the well-being and happiness of all.
