### Making the Best of Winter Weather at School

Principals are often asked how we decide whether it is too cold to allow our students out in the schoolyard for recess.

Fresh air and exercise are important for children. It keeps them physically active, and helps them stay

alert through the school day. Parents/caregivers can help by making sure their children come to school prepared to spend time outdoors. Hats, mitts, boots and a



warm jacket are important to keep students comfortable during lunch, recesses and outdoor play and exploration time for students in Kindergarten.

Extreme cold can be dangerous, and we understand that parents/caregivers want to know that their children will be safe. When the temperature is predicted to drop below -15C, the City of Toronto may declare a cold weather alert. Schools are very sensitive to the needs of our students and pay close attention to the weather, especially when the wind chill is below -20C. The TDSB Severe Weather Protocol is flexible, so that every principal can make a decision that meets the needs of their school. It sets guidelines for when to allow students outside for recess, when to make outdoor breaks shorter, and when to keep students inside altogether.

Canadian winters can be wonderful but when the weather is cold, school staff keep an eye on the temperature and on the needs of our students, a perfect balance of fun and safety.

Winter weather conditions sometimes warrant indoor recess, lunch and pre-entry periods for the safety of students and staff. Refer to the following guidelines:

When temperature and/or wind chill factor indicates -28C or lower, students will remain indoors due to risk of frostnip and frostbite. When temperature and/or wind chill factor indicates -20 to -28C, recesses may be shortened to 10 minutes and lunch

recess to 20 minutes depending on local conditions. Students should be monitored for signs of frostnip, frostbite or difficulty breathing.

#### Free Glasses for Students

We are able to help families get free eyeglasses for students as long as we have a copy of your child's prescription. It is important to note that you are able to, and are encouraged to take your child(ren) to an



optometrist for a yearly vision check. This is at no charge to parents/caregivers as it is covered by OHIP for children. If your child needs glasses and you do not have coverage, please call the school and let us know and we will assist you.
