On January 24th our school took part in Bell Let's Talk Day which focuses on positive mental health and well being. Our Healthy Schools Leadership Team invited students to write down something positive about themselves or someone else and to hang it on our Bell Let's Talk

board. This resulted in a wall full of student affirmations! Affirmations such as, "I can do everything. I am kind. I am honest." Affirmations can play an important part of building positive mental health for all of us. We invite our families to share affirmations with their children at home as well to support our work as a school with mental health and well being.

On February 9th celebrated the 100th Day of School! Our Kindergarten and Grades 1-3 sudents engaged in fun activities throughout the day to celebrate. These activities included books



and poems and integrated counting to

100 in a variety of ways (by 5s, by 10s, by 2s) while making things like 100s crowns and 100s paper chains. It was a fun day of celebrating!

As well. on February 28th our school will taking part in Pink Shirt Day. This Pink Shirt Day focuses on Lifting Each Other Up with our actions and our words which aligns with our school wide goal of creating



conditions of Joy and Belonging for all. We invite students, staff and parents/caregivers to wear pink on this day in support of Pink Shirt Day.

School Improvement Planning Goals

As a school we have been focusing on learning about and sharing what brings our students a sense of Joy and Belonging at school. Creating learning spaces and a school that supports Joy and Belonging for our students is one of our School Improvement goals. In Kindergarten to Grade 3 the common themes are: playing, friends, family, calmness, being safe and included. In Grades 4-6 some of the common themes are: friends and family, sports/movement, being part of a team, kind/nice words, religion and learning. When students feel joy and belonging, engagement and academic achievement follow. All of the work we do is centered around affirming student identity and providing equitable outcomes for all students. We also are continuing our focus on supporting student's mathematics skills - early years foundational mathematics skills and for our junior students creating learning opportunities for the application of concepts embedded in rich mathematical problem solving experiences, and literacy skills with a specific focus on implementing the new Language Curriculum and the Science of Reading strategies.

We encourage our families to ask their child's teacher how they can support their child's learning at home as well, and to attend the various workshops that are offered through the TDSB and/or the school that focus on these areas of focus as we continue to work in partnership to support your child/children's ongoing learning and growth.

Travelling To and From School

Thank you to the many families who continue to walk with their children and from school. Walking to school helps to reduce traffic congestion around our school during drop off and pick up times which helps to make drop off and pick up go more smoothly on our surrounding streets.



Remember, please do to not park in the bus loading zone on Malvern Drive as our school buses need to use this zone to drop off and pick up students. Parking in this zone is illegal.

We understand that traffic congestion can be frustrating and we appreciate the patience of our families as you wait patiently for driving paths to clear out on the street. Driving cautiously around the school zone is important as we have over 300 children entering and exiting our school each day. The good news is it usually only takes about 5-10 minutes at the beginning and end of the school day, and then everyone is on their way to wherever they are going next. We appreciate your support as you work with our crossing guards and school staff while they support students and their families during these busy times. ©

African Heritage (Black History) Month


At TDSB, a motion to recognize African Heritage (Black History) Month was carried in January 2002 and reaffirmed again in January 2004. During the month of February, African Heritage (Black History) Month is recognized across Canada thanks to The Honourable MP Jean Augustine, who introduced the motion in the House of Commons in December 1995; it officially took effect in February 1996. The Black History Month Act was also passed in Ontario in 2016 and has been formally recognized since.

African Heritage (Black History) Month is an occasion to commemorate present and past individuals who helped shape the path of our future student leaders, while also celebrating the many achievements and contributions of numerous individuals with this heritage! Their voices and actions impact our society, and work to continuously improve the world we live in.


