What does perseverance mean to you?

Your child can show perseverance by:

- Sticking to a task, even though they want to give up.
- Wanting to continue with something they are finding hard to learn.
- Setting achievable goals and celebrating when they are met.

Questions to discuss with your child:

- What does it mean to persevere?
- What are some strategies that can be used when you want to give up?
- Why is perseverance important and what are some of its rewards?

Projects to do together:

• Talk about and agree on a family commitment motto. Decide on a family motto related to perseverance.

- Make a list of achievable goals, including personal goals, family goals and school-related goals.
- Help your child set achievable goals and assist them in achieving them.
- Discuss a role model and how they have persevered to achieve their goals and dreams.

Encouraging perseverance in your child:

- Encourage and praise your child to persevere, even when they want to give up.
- Reflect periodically on your child's personal, academic, and social goals the gains they have made towards attaining their goals and/or any setbacks, adjust goals as needed.
- Discuss the importance of planning, prioritizing, organizing and managing time as strategies to achieve goals.
- If your child exhibits perseverance, let them know that you have noticed and are proud!
