Administrators' Message

This month's Character Trait focus is Honesty. We speak with students about the importance of always telling the truth, even if that means they, or someone else, may get into trouble for doing something wrong. We often remind our students about the importance of honesty and owning their actions at all times (the good actions and sometimes the not so good ones). We are always learning from the choices we make, and we recognize that being honest and taking responsibility for what we do and say can be hard sometimes, but it is a very important life lesson. Honesty is the best policy!



At the end of January we welcomed Trustee Rajakulasingam and Superintendent Gala to our school for a visit. This month Learning Centre 3 Executive Superintendent Strangway will come to see our school, along with Superintendent Gala. We are proud to highlight the wonderful learning and teaching going on in our school, and are excited to celebrate our amazing community of learners and their families, and of course our staff.

Our staff Professional development continues to focus on foundational literacy skills and using explicit targeted instruction to build students' literacy skills. When you walk around the school you can see students learning letter sounds, how to blend sounds together when reading and writing, and students learning various reading comprehension strategies and how to apply these strategies to gain meaning from texts. Our mathematics professional development sessions are currently focusing on building early numeracy skills in Grades 1-3. These

sessions for teachers followed the Building Thinking Classrooms sessions that our Grade 4-6 teachers attended which focused on rich math tasks, collaborative problem solving amongst students and explaining math thinking and reasoning.

High Water Levels Brings Increased Risks

The Toronto and Region Conservation monitors hazardous ice conditions as thaw begins and are reminding everyone to be very careful around all bodies of water. The first hint of warming weather and the promise of spring thaw can bring extreme danger to the shores and surfaces of streams, rivers, ponds and lakes, according to Toronto and Region Conservation. As warmer temperatures arrive, stream banks become increasingly slippery and unstable. Lake and river ice weakens, becoming thinner or with higher flows breaking with little or no warning.

During this time, the potential for flooding and ice jamming is high. Higher, faster-flowing water and extreme cold temperatures combine to create increased dangers on or near rivers, streams and ponds for people wishing to enjoy the seasonal changes. Parents and caregivers are being asked to keep children away from stream banks, ponds and

lakes.
