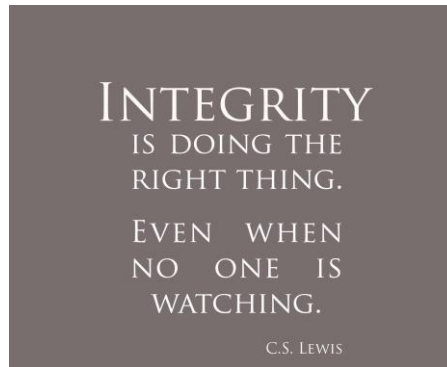

Your child can show integrity by:

- Being honest and trustworthy toward peers, friends, and family members.
- Admitting mistakes and learning from them.
- Making the right choices and following through with the appropriate actions.

Questions to discuss with your child:

- Discuss the importance of standing by what you believe, while being open to learning about and understanding differing perspectives.
- Tell your child where you stand on important issues and discuss your reasons for taking that stand.

Projects to do together:

- Brainstorm a list of controversial topics. Discuss both points of view of the topic.
- Watch a show, video clip or movie in which characters show integrity and talk about the various ways in which those characters acted with integrity.
- Discuss and share examples of situations in which a family member acted with integrity.

Encouraging integrity in your child:

- Talk to your child about what it means to have integrity.
- Encourage and praise your child when they show integrity.
- Provide your child with opportunities to actively engage in discussions that will help develop their opinions.
- Encourage your child to think about whether something is ethically right or wrong.
