DIWALI

Diwali, the festival of lights, is celebrated by Hindus, Sikhs and Jains in India and around the world. This year, we will celebrate on November 4th.

The historical events and stories may be different for each Faith, but this festival represents the same symbolic victory of light over darkness, knowledge over ignorance and good over evil. It is celebrated for three to five days.

We look forward to celebrating Diwali and recognizing those families who partake in the many rituals like lighting Diyas and making Rangoli designs. Students will have the opportunity to use their voice by sharing on the announcements ways that they celebrate this wonderful occasion. If your child would like to participate in this, please ensure you or your child speaks to his/her teacher.

Diwali is typically celebrated with the entire family and extended family. It provides ample time for love, joy, laughter, fun, excitement, reverence and sharing. It unites family members and helps renew family ties. It provides grandparents an opportunity to share family traditions and gives them an opportunity to pass on the family artefacts and heirlooms to the next generation. We know that this year during Covid-19 that these celebrations may be modified and we wish all those celebrating a Happy Diwali.

Early French Immersion Application Process

As you know, the entry point to Early French Immersion is currently Senior Kindergarten. However, the entry point will change to Junior Kindergarten for September 2022.

There will be a one transition year wherein students who will be entering Junior Kindergarten and Senior Kindergarten in 2022 will be eligible to apply to the Early French Immersion program during the November 2021 application period. Moving forward (2023), the



only entry point for Early French Immersion will be Junior Kindergarten.

The application to the Early French Immersion program will remain an online process managed by the Central French Department and will take place during the month of November. Engaging Math tasks!

Students are busy using their creativity and problem solving skills collaboratively in Ms Lau's Gr. 3 classroom.

Students were busy and having a lot of fun building bridges using only paper. The

learning goal was to find where their bridges failed in holding up pennies and a mini pumpkin. Students noticed where the bridge sank or started bending too much and worked on



reinforcing those areas.
These students had so much fun and did not want it to end. Tasks like these ensure students are engaged help with consolidating understanding of number sense and other math concepts.

Independent Writing in Gr. 2

Part of the process with students becoming expert writers includes the process of seeing their growth. Here is an example of student writing in Ms Thai's Gr. 2 classroom. Every month, students can see their growth with using descriptive words, correct punctuation and creative ideas and connections in their writing. Kudos to Ms Thai's students!!!!



Another teaching tool is building a "growth mindset" with our students.

Student's in Ms Thai's class read the book 'The Dot'. A story about a girl named Vashti (how her thinking moved from a 'Fixed Mindset' to a 'Growth Mindset') and what she was able to achieve when her mindset shifted.

Students created their artwork on plates using dots. They had to design a plate that used dots and had a pattern (integrating what students have been learning in math).
