d. Planning for our School Organization in Sept. 2018 - We will soon be coming together as a staff to carefully consider class placements for the 2018-2019 school year. The following will be communicated in our May Newsletter. The staff at McKee care deeply about student needs. Years of meeting the learning needs of children give our teachers the unique qualifications to recommend student placement decisions. Rest assured that placing students and balancing classes will include the best opportunities for student achievement and wellbeing. A balanced class reflects the diversity of our community and allows the variety of interests and talents of our learners to emerge and be appreciated. Each new school year brings opportunities to meet new friends and expand our circle of acquaintances. School becomes more comfortable and familiar and accordingly our potentials have great possibilities of realization.

The following are the criteria we use to guide our placements:

<u>Balance of Ability, Interests and Talents</u> - all children are unique and different. The teacher's task of providing meaningful learning programs is enhanced when classes are created to accommodate instructional groupings.

<u>Learning Style</u> - how does the learner go about the process of learning? What kind of environment would best suit the learner?

<u>Social Blending</u> - what is the best cluster of individuals to effectively and efficiently learn? This should not be viewed as a grouping of friends. At particular stages, some close friends learn best in separate classes.

Do we need to know something particular about your student that you feel we do not already know? Letters stating a particular teacher, a request for your child to be with a specific friend or a request to NOT be in a combined grade - are not reasons to write administration a letter. If you have information to share with us, it must be shared in writing by May 15, 2016.

- g. Indigenous PD Each Gr. 1-5 teacher was released for 1 hour to discuss "burning questions" regarding Indigenous teaching and learning focus on Truth and Reconciliation and the Calls to Action. Marianne Groat IL was very impressed with the level of knowledge and commitment of our staff with embedding Aboriginal learning into programming. An Indigenous Aboriginal Leader was invited to answer questions of our staff. 16 of our of 44 staff enrolled in this aboriginal PD education.
- h. **Newcomer Program** Mckee brought in this year TDSB Funded program to focus on Grade 3,4,5 new arrivals. This program provides language development activities based on Canadian Culture, Art & Play. During lunchtime session and after school students are pulled out to participate. Now Grades 1 & 2 people will be drawn from classes during school hours this makes for a smaller group setting with similar activities. After this 6-8 week session, they plan to go on a trip to brickworks for outdoor celebration.
- i. **Music Request** we would like to request \$\$\$ to cover the Cuban Brazilian instructor who worked with our students over a 6 week period.
