	ProGrant use must be mental health related and have parent engagement. Last year, the grant was applied towards – mental health literacy – might be helpful for parents to hear about and helping to build resiliency.	
	Andrew had a conversation with Jonathan prior to this meeting to discuss what we could do with that ProGrant money.	
	Jonathan has been working in child and mental health for about 20 years. Adults give kids advice for how to manage stress, but no one explains why (what's going on at that moment that's causing the challenge). Parents don't have a good understanding of why it's happening. Jonathan has supported teams that do work with young children to have the capacity to understand the concepts if presented in the right way.	
	<ul> <li>Suggestion for Progrant use towards:</li> <li>Have a session where you invite children and parents, and this will give parents tools to help their kids at home. The session would be part of the school day, where you would invite the parents. Jonathan could host a Q&amp;A with the parents after the session.</li> <li>Can we have the session aimed at kids younger than Grade 5? Especially since McKee has been intentional about trying to help Grade 5 kids</li> </ul>
