Terry Fox Kick Off Assembly

Terry Fox Run

Our IB Learner trait for the month of September is caring. Milne Valley's MYP students learn about each trait by connecting to an influential person who embodies the trait. The trait of caring is exemplified in Terry Fox.

The Terry Fox Kickoff Assembly included a visit from Lisa from Terry Fox Canada who taught students about the distance Terry ran each day. Lisa also shared information about the prosthetic leg Terry used. Each student was challenged to bring a toonie for Terry.

Our Terry Fox Run took place on September 28th. Students walked, jogged and ran around the perimeter of the school to recognize Terry's contribution to cancer research. This year Milne Valley staff and students raised \$ 2, 055. Our top three fundraising classes were:

- 1. 6-5 raised \$281
- 2. 7-6 raised \$230
- 3. 8-8 raised \$151

Thank you for Mr. Shim for his organization of the Terry Fox Run at Milne Valley for the past 15 years supporting students and staff to raise \$56 000. Our Terry Fox Run was fantastic way to end our focus on caring for the month of September.



Aussie Football Comes To Milne Valley

Milne Valley students had the opportunity to learn a new sport this fall, Aussie Football. Aussie X explores growth mindset through the Australian sport of footy. Students were challenged to "Have A Go" at something new. The program incorporates movement, mindfulness and mateship encouraging students to build their resilience and confidence. Milne Valley looks forward to working with the staff from X - Movement again later in the school year.

October IB Trait – Open Minded

Open Minded is the IB learner trait for October. Milne Valley MYP students are encouraged to understand and appreciate their own cultures and personal histories. They are supported to be open to the perspectives, values and traditions of other individuals and communities. They seek out and evaluate different points of view, and are willing to grow from this experience.

Steve Jobs, the founder of Apple exemplifies the trait, open-minded. Jobs challenged his creative team to "think differently" resulting in a variety of technological innovations such personal laptops, touch screen tablets and the iphone.





Community Service at MVMS

Community Service is an important part of the MYP program and enables students to become active members of the community, as well as preparing them for community service requirements in high school.

The grade six and grade seven community service programs began with kick-off assemblies at the end of September, and is officially starting at the beginning of October. Students are reminded that their community service hours and reflections must be complete by June 1st. Grade six requires six hours of community service with at least two meaningful activities in one of the three categories of community - local, school, and global. Grade seven students must complete seven hours in at least two of the categories, with a minimum of two meaningful activities in each.

Grade eight students are required to complete the MYP Community Project. The project reflects the IB ideology to put their ideas regarding community service into action in order to address a need in the local, school, or global community. The Community Project should take approximately fifteen hours to complete over the course of the school year.

The investigation phase of the project must be completed by the end of November and needs to be reviewed by the student or group's teacher advisor. Students who need suggestions for community service hours or community project ideas, can speak to their homeroom teacher/staff advisor or to Ms. Masci or Mr. Matte.

Road Safety Campaign

It's back to school time and the TDSB is launching a three-week-long road safety campaign aimed to raise awareness and promote road safety around schools.

You will notice the City of Toronto "Whoa! Slow down" lawn signs displayed on school property. These signs are intended to remind drivers to slow down in school zones!

In recent years, TDSB staff has been working closely with the City of Toronto's Transportation Services, Toronto Public Health and other community partners to improve road safety for school aged children and youth in the City of Toronto. In 2017, the TDSB launched its Traffic Safety Program (TSP), which encourages the implementation of education and engineering measures to improve safety. The TSP program aligns with the City of Toronto's Vision Zero Road Safety Plan – a five year \$108 million plan to reduce the number of traffic-related deaths and serious injuries on Toronto's roads.
