Progress Reports and Kindergarten Communication of Learning

On Wednesday, November 15, you will be receiving either their Kindergarten Communication of Learning report or their Progress Report if they are in Grades 1-8.

These reports let you know early in the school year about your child's progress. For academic subjects like math, language, and science, the progress report tells you whether your child is progressing very well, well, or with difficulty. Progress reports do not have letter grades or percentage marks.

Connected to the November reporting period is the opportunity for families to have a conversation with their child's teacher. Parent/Guardian-Teacher Interviews will be done on Thursday November 16th in the evening and Friday November 17th in the morning. Please note that Friday November 17th is a P.A Day for students. Your child(ren)'s teacher will arrange to have a discussion with you about your child(ren)'s progress.
