

CAT4 Information for Parents and Guardians

Our school is one of the 150 schools that are part of the TDSB's Model Schools for Inner Cities (MSIC) program. The school board provides all MSIC schools with extra resources, programs and services in order to offer their students all-round support to succeed in school.

In the beginning of the school year, your child will take the Canadian Achievement Test (CAT4) in order to assess their foundation skills in reading, writing and math. The CAT4 test results will be reported to parents and classroom teachers for improvement purposes.
