Step 1 – Classroom Teacher

Your child's classroom teacher is the first place to go for classroom-related questions or concerns, including:

- Classroom routines, rules, and consequences
- Homework and assignments
- Classroom learning and day-to-day support

Step 2 – School Principal

If you would like more information or your concern is beyond the classroom level, please contact the Principal. I can help with:

- School-wide concerns or processes
- Student registration and schedules
- Report card concerns
- Code of Conduct and school expectations
- Safety and security
- Budget, fundraising, and School Council

Step 3 – School Superintendent

Superintendents support a Family of Schools and can be contacted if questions have not been resolved at the school level, or for support with:

- Alternate attendance requests
- Suspension appeals
- Additional system-level support

We've been experiencing challenges at the end of the day due to regular early pick-ups occurring at 3:15 p.m. or later.
