- Order has been placed. Company sent an email stating that Board of Trustees approved a new provider for interactive learning items.
- First choice turns white board into smart board
- Second Choice \$1100 projector that makes any

- surface interactive. Need a laptop and projector.
- New smart boards are not available because they changed their policies and new purchases are cost prohibitive. Previously purchased smart boards are not impacted, only new purchases.
- Dasantila raised a question about the cost effectiveness of purchasing smart boards as opposed to cheaper, simpler technologies. Mary explained that the interactive learning is very important. The potential for learning is amazing and helps teachers to be more efficient.
- Fion asked about the support for the smart boards going forward and Mary explained that the board buys 5-7 year warranties and the board supports it after that.
- Mary hopes to place order in the next few weeks.
