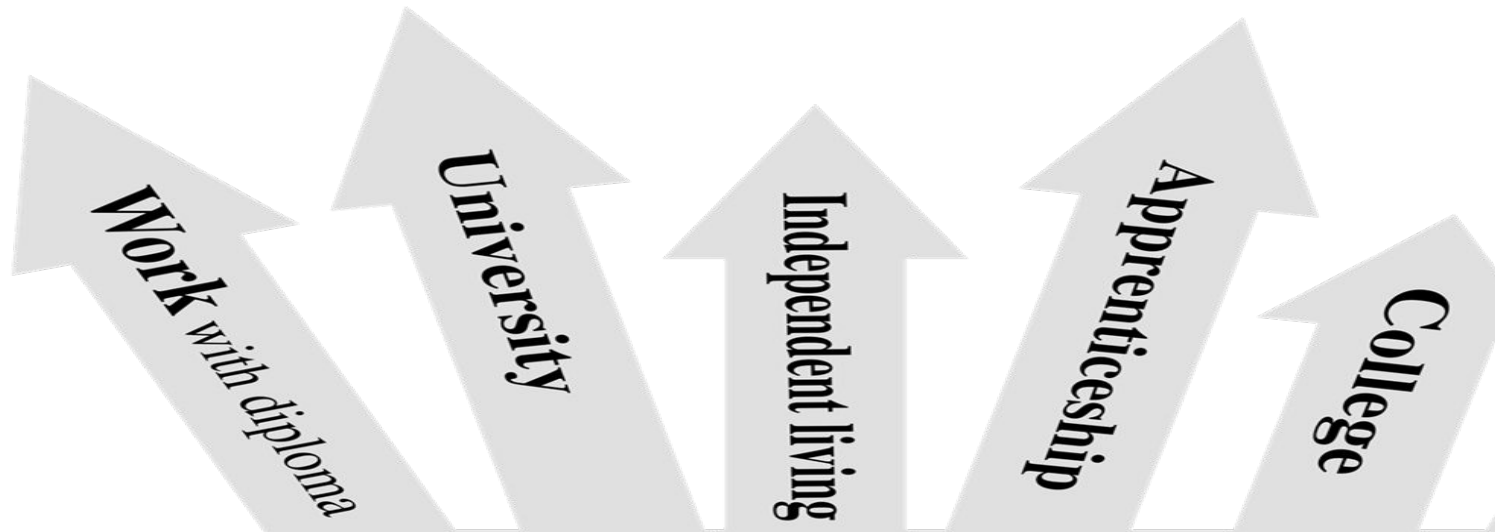

Do Students' Course Choices Have an Impact on Postsecondary Options?

- Yes!
- Many grade 11 courses are pre-requisites for grade 12 courses
- It is important to research programs and consult with your guidance counsellor, as needed
