School Bus Procedures

If your child takes the school bus to Northview, please read the following regarding parental late drop offs and early pick-ups:

- 1. Please continue to notify the bus company **directly** of any changes to pick up and drop off.
- NEW- please email <u>Amanda.Drover-Soriano@tdsb.on.ca</u> and <u>Leanne.McGuirk@tdsb.on.ca</u> to advise if your child will not be on the bus in the morning or afternoon(whichever applies).
- NEW- If your child comes to school late or gets picked up early (not being on the bus for that specific day in the morning or afternoon) please:



A. If you are dropping your child off, they must go to the main office BEFORE going to class and sign in, stating that they normally take the bus. If you cannot come in with your child and they need assistance signing in, please call the school and ask for a safety monitor to meet you at the door you are at and they will support your child signing in. **OR**

B. If you are signing your child out early, please do so at the main office AND tell the office that your child takes the school bus.

By following this procedure we will ensure your child's safety with clear communication between numerous people.

Student Activity Fee

Thank you to families who have paid the Student Activity Fee and/or purchased a yearbook. Payment of the fee is required for every Northview student. The fee includes the Northview student ID card, (for the TTC, Toronto Public Library, etc). The fees are used to subsidize extra-curricular programs, clubs, councils, student unions, SAC events such as semi-formal, the Phoenix Fest carnival, guest speakers and initiatives throughout the year.

Please pay the fee ASAP so that all students can participate right away in clubs and councils. Families can contact a Vice Principal with any questions. All school <u>payments can</u> <u>be made through School Cash On-Line</u>.

Permission/Consent and Medical Forms

Every Northview family must submit a completed forms package. The **Start of Year Forms and Student Device Agreement** was sent to all students at the end of August 2024. A completed forms package must be on file for every student registered at Northview. Weekly reminders will be sent to families who have not completed the forms. 1:1 Devices for Grade 9 Students

Students in grades 5 & 9 will receive a **TDSB-owned & managed Chromebook**. The program's purpose is to empower students to use technology for learning when and as needed. Students are encouraged to use the device during school and take it home daily, on weekends and holidays, including the summer. The device will be assigned to students and will remain with the student for four years.



In order to receive a device, parents must sign the <u>Student Device Agreement</u>, which was emailed with the Start of Year forms.

1:1 Devices for Senior Students or Students New to the TDSB

If your child is in Grade 10-12 and / or new to the TDSB and would like to opt-in to 1:1 Device Program, they need to see Ms. Lainas-Hayward in the Library for the Student Device Agreement form. Please sign and return the form to the Library by October 10th.
