# 1:1 Devices for Grade 9 Students

Students in grades 5 & 9 will receive a TDSB-owned & managed Chromebook. The program's purpose is to empower students to use technology for learning when and as needed. Students are encouraged to use the device during school and take it home daily, on weekends and holidays, including the summer. The device will be assigned to students and will remain with the student for four years.



In order to receive a device, parents must sign the <u>Student Device Agreement</u>, which was emailed with the Start of Year forms.

free, confidential service 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. As the Service is now available across all neighbourhoods, delivered by mobile crisis teams, it provides individuals with access to timely assistance, regardless of location.

In addition to immediate support, TCCS also offers:

- Referrals and connections to additional services
- Information and resources
- Post-crisis follow-up care
