#### Breakfast Program

Northview's **Grab'n'Go Breakfast Program** begins in the front foyer from 8:15-8:45 on Monday. All items are vetted for allergens and nutritional value, and there is no charge to students.

#### **Student Lockers**

Locker distribution will begin on Tuesday morning with students having the **opportunity to select their locker location**. Returning Grade 10-12 students need to bring in their Northview-approved lock from last year. Grade 9s will be provided a free lock; students may purchase new and used replacement locks in the main office for \$5 and \$10.

#### School Start-Up forms and Student Device Agreement

The **Start of Year Forms and Student Device Agreement** were sent to all secondary student primary email contacts IT Services on August 29. IT Services will send reminders to families who have not completed the forms. Forms in this year's package include:

#### Province-Wide Vape Mobile Device Ban

Beginning on September 1, 2024, the Ministry of Education has provided <u>new direction</u> around vape and mobile device use in all Ontario schools. By reducing the distraction of cell phones and mobile devices, together we can create more focused and engaging learning environments for students. Families are encouraged to review the new <u>TDSB Mobile Device Policy</u> and the corresponding <u>Letter from the</u> <u>Minister of Education</u>. (See poster below)





At Northview Heights SS, **all personal communication devices** (cell phones, tablets and other smart devices) must be powered off and stored completely out of view during all instructional classes except with the permission of the classroom teacher granted immediately prior to each use.

Below is a summary of the province's requirements for cell phone/mobile device use, effective **September 1, 2024:** 

- All Members of the School Community All members of the school community must not use personal mobile devices during instructional time except for educational purposes (as directed by an educator), for health and medical purposes, or to support special education needs.
- Students in Grades 6 and Below Students' personal mobile devices must be stored out of view and powered off or set to silent mode throughout the full instructional day, except when their use is explicitly permitted by the educator under the circumstances outlined above. If an educator sees a personal mobile device that is not stored out of view, they must require the device be handed in for the instructional day and the device must be placed, by the student, in a storage area in a location designated by the principal.
- Students in Grades 7 to 12 Personal mobile devices must be stored out of view and powered off or set to silent mode during instructional time, except when their use is explicitly permitted by the educator under the circumstances outlined above. If the educator sees a personal mobile device that is not stored out of view, they must require the device be handed in for the instructional period and the device must be placed, by the student, in a storage area in a location in the classroom designated by the educator.

#### **Student Conduct Safety**

A positive school climate and a safe learning and teaching environment are essential for student success. We believe that everyone has a role to play in promoting a positive school climate. Next week, we will be sharing the updated Student Handbook for families to review. school policies and expectations. On **Thursday and Friday, September 19 & 20**, students will participate in a Welcome & Expectations Assembly to go over some of the highlights pertaining to school safety, code of conduct, and the TDSB Policies and Chart of Consequences. Many of these items are in the <u>official welcome to the new school year from the TDSB</u> that includes many important dates, documents, policies and resources included.

#### **Special Education Welcome**

As we wrap up the first week of school, we in the Special Education Department hope that your child had a great week. As students move from their Elementary schools to Northview we are getting to know them and are here to support their needs. Our office is located in Student Success across from the Main Office. Leanne McGuirk is the ACL of MID and Special Education students whose surname starts with A-L and <u>Amanda Drover-Soriano</u> is the ACL of ASD and Special Education students whose surname starts whose surname starts with M-Z.

#### For all students with an IEP:

*Parent/Guardian Consultation Letters* will be coming home next week. Please return the form to school with your child as soon as possible. We value your input and appreciate your attention to this crucial form of communication.

For those students who have a Specialized Equipment Allocation (SEA) we are asking for your help in getting their technology into Northview and, most importantly, into the hands of their owners. If your child/children had a SEA device in Grade 8 that you are certain is not currently physically with them, we ask that you help us by:

- 1. Reaching out to the Grade 8 school and requesting that your child's SEA device be Transferred to Northview Heights SS attention to Amanda Drover-Soriano
- 2. Email <u>Amanda.Drover-Soriano@tdsb.on.ca</u> and notify her that the request has been made. Please include the student's name, name of the elementary school and what kind of device it is.

#### **Student Activity Fee**

Payment of the \$50 Student Activity Fee is required for every student registered at Northview. The school activity fee will enable students to obtain a yearbook, a photo student activity card, and access to a variety of clubs and outreach activities, guest speakers, drama, arts, music productions, and a Dudley lock for grade 9s if required. The School Activity Fee of \$50 must be paid in order to receive a SAC photo card.
