A reminder that we will be celebrating our 2026 Graduates on Friday June 26, 2026 at 10:30 a.m. at Montecassino Hotel & Event Centre, 3710 Chesswood Dr., North York ON M3J 2W4. Graduates are welcome to bring up to two guests.

Important: Montecassino Hotel & Event Centre staff will not allow anyone into the event without a ticket. Graduates wearing their cap and gown will not need a ticket to get into the venue.

Please take note of the following important items:

- Graduates with student ID should have picked up their gown, cap, tassel and guest tickets during the second week of June.
- Graduates must arrive at Montecassino Hotel by 9:00 a.m. in full cap and gown to receive their marshalling cards and to be organized into processional order.
- Doors open to guests with tickets at 10:00 a.m.
- Guests must remain seated until all graduates have crossed the stage.
- A professional photographer will be on site to photograph every Graduate as they take the stage. Photographs will be available for purchase.
- **No guests will be permitted to stand in the aisles or approach the stage to take photos.**

Graduates who paid to have portraits done will receive a composite photo of the entire graduating class. When available, all graduates will be able to download an individual, professional photo of them receiving their diploma.

Please consider that, while graduation is very much a family celebration, it is a formal event involving long periods of sitting quietly which may be difficult for young children.

Information for Students Taking a TDSB Summer school course:

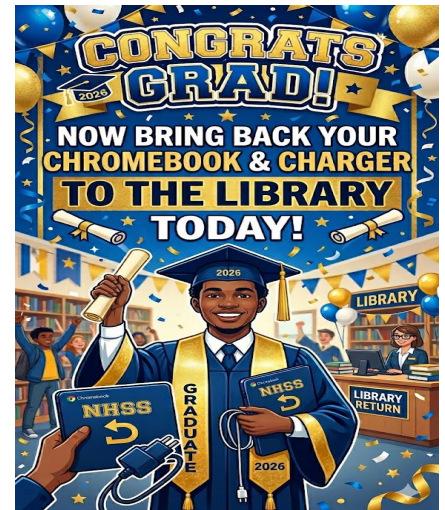
- Grade 12 students taking a TDSB-provided summer course will be able to retain their device.

**Guidance News:**

DUAL CREDITS – Take a College Course while still in High School – Summer & Fall Registration has opened.

What is a Dual Credit?

- A dual credit is a **college course**, delivered on a college campus, by a college professor which you add into your regular homeschool timetable.
- They are called **DUAL** credits because students earn **TWO** credits: a secondary high school credit AND a college credit
- Dual credits require **half the in-class time** as a traditional high school course and are offered once per week for a 3-4 hour block of time.
- Dual credits are **FREE** - tuition, transportation and supplies are all included
- Course offerings include a **huge array of interest areas and potential careers paths** which go above and beyond what is offered at high school, many are lab or shop based with hands on experiences. While others provide you with a lecture style format in a college classroom.
- Dual credit programs are intended to assist secondary school students in completing their OSSD and supporting a successful transition to college and/or apprenticeship programs.
- Students in Cooperative Education, Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) programs and students in the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP) may also be eligible to participate in dual credit programs.

Semester Mid-term marks have now been uploaded into student accounts. It is the responsibility of the student to check their accounts for accuracy.

- Mid-terms marks should now appear on your accounts. Please see Ms. Tanrikulu as soon as possible if you see any errors or if something is missing.
- If you are taking private school course, your private school principal should have uploaded the course and mid term mark, and you should be able to see it.
- If you are taking a night school course with another school board (e.g. TCDSB, etc.) you should have been sent your mid-term report card. Please bring this mid-term report card to
- Ms. Tanrikulu as soon as possible so that the mid term mark can be added.
- Also, for OUAC accounts, make sure you see, "Will achieve OSSD..."

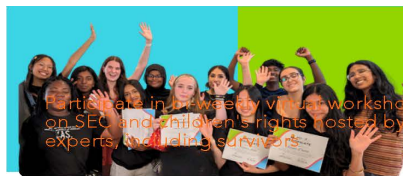
