PLANNING FOR THE 2018-2019 SCHOOL YEAR

Making up the class composition is a task that requires much thought, care, time and teamwork. The teachers and I consider many areas in order to create the most ideal learning and teaching environment for our students. We take into consideration:

- academic ability
- learning styles of our students
- gender
- learning needs
- social groupings
- friendships

Because there are often families that move over the summer and because of the Ministry caps on primary class sizes, we often find that we need to make some minor adjustments to the number of students in the classes in September. At times, there are also staff changes (retirements, leaves, transfers). To avoid disappointment and to ensure that each classroom is the best it can be for our students, we will finalize the classes just before the school year starts. We intend to post your child's classroom number in the school's front foyer on Tuesday, September 4, 2018. Although school begins at 8:40 a.m., you may wish to arrive a bit earlier to check the class lists.

The classrooms are organized based on projected student enrolment. At the end of September, when actual student numbers are known, it may be necessary to reorganize.

*In order to assist us with actual figures, if you know that your child will not be returning to OOOPS in September (ie: moving, French Immersion, etc.), please let us know as soon as possible.

The Primary and Junior EQAO testing will take place from May 22 to June 4. Students are also practicing former EQAO questions, problem solving and test taking strategies on an ongoing basis in the classroom. It is always beneficial for parents to familiarize themselves with various types of assessments the children encounter. We will continue to work and support the children to ensure they are prepared and not feeling stressed.

Students will be walking to the Bickford Centre with their classes. Parents (with a police reference check) wishing to escort the classes to the Bickford Centre are most welcome. Parents are also welcome to be at the Bickford Centre in advance, as an audience member.

EARTH HOUR/EARTH DAY

OOOPS participated in the TDSB's Earth Hour on Friday, March 23rd. From 2-3 p.m., the entire school went electricity-free for ONE HOUR. Wherever possible, our school and office turned off all interior lighting, except necessary emergency lights. Earth Day will take place on April 22nd with the emphasis on: "Consuming Less and Playing More". Earth Hour and Earth Day are wonderfully inclusive campaigns – the youngest children can participate and learn about energy conservation and slowing climate change.

SONG WRITER'S CLUB

On Thursday, March 22nd, the Grade 4 and 5 members of the Song Writer's Club welcomed a special guest to OOOPS. Singer/Songwriter Royal Wood, spent a good part of the morning guiding the group through the song writing process and by the end of the session, everyone was singing and playing the song they had composed together. Many thanks to Massey Hall for funding this pilot project, as well as to Musician and Music Educator Mr. Doug Friesen, who invited OOOPS to participate. Mr. Friesen will meet several times with the group between now and Royal's next visit to assist Ms. Grierson in supporting the student song writers as they develop their musical ideas even further. GLOBAL MUSIC PROGRAM

In April and May, the junior students will be working with percussionist Joaquin Nunez Hidalgo in their music classes to learn about the instruments and music of Brazil and Cuba. This is part of the TDSB's Global Music Program, which provides two sessions with Mr. Hidalgo, as well as the loan of a kit of instruments, including cajons, bongos, congas and other Latin instruments.

<u>KINDNESS PROGRAM - Values Through Humane</u> Education Program

On March 20, 21 and 22, students and staff were visited by Karen Bishop and her 4-legged friend Kendal, of the Beatrice Watson-Acheson Kindness Program. The program provides lessons in Humane Education for Kindergarten to Grade 8 classes. The dogs are very docile and have been "trained" to work with children of all ages and are with their owners at all times. The lessons addressed:

- caring and kindness to pets
- the importance of spaying and neutering
- respecting people, animals and the environment
- developing empathy and compassion for all life
- kindness, respect and reverence for all life
