#### **HEAD LICE SCREENING DAY**

Students found to have head lice or nits will bring home a Pediculosis Treatment Sheet and parents/guardians are asked to treat their children so that they can return to school – lice-free. If you do not wish your child to be screened, please inform the school as soon as possible. #### THE FLU AND YOU

TPH suggests the following to avoid the flu:

As mentioned in October's newsletter, OOOPS has launched School Cash Online, an easy to use, safe and convenient way for parents/guardians to pay for their children's school fees, including agendas, yearbooks and class trips – all school fees applicable to your child will be posted on School Cash Online. Once you register, you can choose to purchase the items or activities using a debit or credit card. You will be able to see when the school has a new item posted online for purchase and you will also have the option to be notified whenever your child has a new school event requiring payment.
