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SCHOOL COUNCIL Thank you to everyone who attended our Council meeting on Wednesday, October 25th. Our next Council meeting will take place on Wednesday, November 22nd at 6:30 p.m. Childcare will be provided and everyone is welcome to attend!

SEVERE WEATHER In the event of severe or rapidly deteriorating weather conditions, please keep children at home, if possible. The decision to close schools is made by the Director of Education. Listen to the radio or television for school closures and cancellation of transportation services before the opening of school - cancellations will be announced from 6:30 a.m. onward. Should schools close during the school day, announcements will be made on radio stations by noon and posted on the TDSB website. there is no announcement about school closing by noon, school will remain open for the day. Please be prepared to pick up your child or make arrangements for your child, if required, should schools close early. Please ensure that we have an emergency number where you, or a responsible adult to whom you are willing to entrust the care of your child, can be contacted.

IN-DOOR RECESS Weather conditions sometimes warrant that indoor recesses, lunch periods and pre-entry periods be considered necessary for student and staff safety. When temperature and/or wind chill factor indicates -20 to -28C, recesses <u>may</u> be shortened to 10 minutes and lunch recess to 20 minutes depending on local conditions – this is up to the principal's discretion. Recesses <u>will be cancelled</u> when the temperature and/or wind chill factor indicates -28C or colder. Students should come to school prepared for outdoor play with proper gear (snow pants, winter coats, hats, mitts/gloves, scarves, winter boots).

LATES Students should be at school by 8:40 a.m. If not, please come to the office for a late slip. With the inclement weather approaching, please be sure to give yourself extra time in the morning to get to school. A reminder that we have 3 staff on yard duty at 8:25 a.m. – one in the Kindergarten yard and two in the Junior yard.

FRENCH IMMERSION - French Programs Application

Deadline For families interested in the Toronto

District School Board's French Immersion or Extended

French programs, there is an online process for applying
to:

- Early French Immersion (EFI) which begins in Senior Kindergarten:
- Junior Extended French (JEF) which begins in Grade 4 The TDSB offers a guarantee of placement in the program (not a specific school) to all on-time applicants. Transportation is provided as per the Board's Transportation policy.

The timelines for applying for these programs for September 2018 are:

- Applications for Early French Immersion (for a Junior Kindergarten aged child), must be completed online between October 30 and November 30, 2017.
- Applications for Junior Extended French must be completed online between Jan. 8 and Feb. 8, 2018.

Offers of placement within your chosen program will be made to all on-time applicants in the weeks following the close of the application window. Please note: families with an older sibling currently in a French program are still required to complete an online application for the new student.
