In December we will be welcoming the KINDNESS PROGRAM to our school. This is a free program supported by the Beatrice Watson Acheson Foundation. The program's goal is to promote kindness and caring. The presenter will come to the school with her service dog and visit each classroom. ZONES OF REGULATION – what zone are you in?

On November 1st the staff attended a workshop presented by Casey Moore (Special Education Consultant) on the Zones of Regulation. This is a curriculum designed for self-regulation and emotional control. We learned how these zones (blue, green, yellow, red) which refer to how your brain and body are feeling, help students become mindful of their feelings and emotions by asking themselves questions like, "What zone am I in?" Once students learn to identify which zone they are in, they can find ways to selfregulate by asking, "How big is my problem?" Each student will be encouraged to 'create their own toolbox' to help them get through red or yellow zones (ie: take a breath, walk away, count to 10, drink some water, talk it out, stretch, etc.) and return to the green zone. The program is intended to support students to regulate their behaviour and emotions, especially if they are facing challenges academically, socially and/or emotionally. We are trying to implement this approach in all of our classes over the course of the year to see if it is effective for students and their well-being.



THE GIVING TREE

On December 7th we are setting up a Giving Tree outside of the Gym to benefit refugee families at Christie Refugee Welcome Centre. There will be paper 'snowflakes' on the tree, each

written with a basic need item. Parents and children can take one off the tree and bring the NEW item to the office, to put in designated bins. This was a hugely successful initiative last year - one of the best school partnerships Christie had ever had! No toys this year please - they are overflowing with toys, but completely lacking in basic NEW items like winter clothing and diapers. Thanks in advance for your participation!
