Each year the School Board reviews our school's projected enrolment and based upon the capacity of the school site, decisions about optional attendance are made. This year the policy has been revised and there are 2 additional categories for out of area admissions, including *Limited Optional Attendance, Siblings Only*, which applies to us for September 2023.

This means that siblings of students who already attend OOOPS and will be attending in September 2023, can register. For the last few years our school has been closed for Optional Attendance including closed to siblings so this new category for Out of Area Admissions is certainly welcomed. CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

As of Monday, November 28th, the students will have access to more of the back yard of the school including, the primary play structure, the picnic table area, the blue basketball courts, the new basketball courts beside Exit 4, the asphalt area in front of the portables and the field. This is very exciting as progress is being made on this massive project.

<u>Please note:</u> The forest area, the hill and the Dovercourt entrance remain out of bounds and fenced.

The installation of the Junior Play structure, and completion of the board walk through the forest will be completed in the spring. Weather permitting, the construction crew continues to work and to move the project forward.

Beginning Monday, December 5th, students in Gr. 1 – 6 will enter the school at the beginning of the day and be dismissed at the end of the day from the back of the school. Students and parents can access the back of the school in two ways: Via the laneway from Ossington Avenue which is just south of the school or via the Churchill Steps which connect Churchill Avenue to the play yard. Students will no longer enter through the front doors of the school. Please allow additional time to walk to the back of the school at the beginning of the school day and at dismissal. The bell rings at 8:40AM for entry and at 3:20PM for dismissal.

There will be <u>no changes to the routine</u> for kindergarten students. JKSK students will continue to enter the school yard in the front of the school at the beginning of the school day. Dismissal will also be from the front via Exit 2. It is imperative that students enter the school through the gate at the front of the school as staff are checking each student in upon arrival.

ANTI-BULLYING INTERVENTION/PREVENTION

The week of Nov. 21st is Anti-bullying Intervention and Prevention Week and we have focused on anti-bullying strategies and messages and promoted the power of kindness through the daily announcements.

In December, students in Rooms 18 and 20 will be participating in sessions with Child and Youth workers to

explore a variety of themes including peer-relationships, anxiety, and self-esteem. With a focus on finding strategies to improve relationships, reduce anxiety and build self confidence and self-esteem, while promoting kindness and a positive school culture, students will hopefully gain knowledge and develop strategies that they can use when navigating challenging situations

OOOPS CARD PROJECT

Students have been learning about Giving Tuesday, which is on Tuesday, Nov. 29th this year. The Junior students were asked to reflect on the following statement: *If I could wave a magic wand, I would change...* As you can imagine, the students had a lot of ideas/concerns specifically about climate change and water and food insecurity.



All students in the school have been drawing trees to contribute to the OOOPS Card Project. Students have been working hard to create drawings showcasing a tree that can be found in our neighbourhood. The students are focusing on trees because trees can have a positive impact on issues of climate change and food insecurity.



REMEMBRANCE DAY 2022

November 11 was acknowledged by students and staff at a very special assembly.
