DENTAL SCREENING

Toronto Public Health's Dental Team (dental hygienists) will be visiting OOOPS between March 26-28 to identify students with oral health problems. The hygienists will use sterilized instruments and assess the need for topical fluoride, scaling, sealant and any other obvious dental needs. Only parents whose children require dental services will be notified and a note to that effect will be sent home with your child(ren). Students who do not have dental insurance and who cannot afford to pay for dental care may be eligible for services offered by Toronto Public Health.
